7:48 p.m. 1 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I hereby call to order the 2 regularly scheduled Concord Township Board of Trustees meeting 3 for Wednesday, January 6. Please join Paul Malchesky in the 4 Pledge of Allegiance. 5 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.) 6 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I am going to start calling on 7 8 audience members for the Pledge to keep everybody on their 9 toes. It makes everyone a little nervous. Roll call. 10 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Galloway? 11 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I am here. 12 13 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Malchesky? MR. MALCHESKY: Present. 14 MS. DAWSON: Mrs. Luhta? 15 MS. LUHTA: Here. 16 17 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. We've got to do a swearing at -- I mean, a swearing in. Chief, where is our chief? 18 Okay. Raise your right hand, repeat after me. 19 on up. (Whereupon, the oath of office was administered to 20 21 Fire Chief Matthew Sabo.) 22 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Congratulations. 23 CHIEF SABO: Thank you, again. 24 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Pin it right on there. didn't do it right if you didn't draw blood. 25 26 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Stick it, Christine. 27 CHIEF SABO: Thank you. 28 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Chief, why don't you step to the podium and talk to your adoring public. 29 30 CHIEF SABO: Well, once again, thank you for the

support from the community, the trustees, staff of the Concord Township and the members of the Fire Department. It's been a long year and a half or so'ish of getting to where we're at, and all I can say is I thank each one of you for your support and look forward to moving into the future and taking this department to new places. I thank my family: Christie; Nathan; Nicole is not here, she's at work; my parents, Don, Martha; my mother-in-law, Cindy; and anyone that just took the time out to come out and celebrate with me and wish me well. So thank you very much.

CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Since we have lots of the folks in the department here, I would point out that, when we started this process over a year ago, we used the fire chief hiring protocol and process that the Ohio Fire Chiefs Association has in place. And so we, as a township, hired them to lead our search and lead the community through that, and that was a national search. There were applicants from across the country. It wasn't a matter of just hiring the next guy within. We did an exhaustive search. And we're very pleased and happy that one of our own rose to the top of all of that and we were able to promote from within someone, Matt, who is, you know, extremely well deserving in leading this department going forward and serving the residents of this community.

And I know that we made the right decision that, subsequently, talking to other fire chiefs around the community, just running into them and at events and things and them saying to me how highly thought of Matt is in the fire community in this area and that they think we have made a great hire.

So I think that department is in great hands, with

all of you that work so hard for this community every day 1 keeping us safe. We're very appreciative. And I know that 2 Matt is going to lead this department for years to come and 3 keep it on the good path and in the right direction. So, Matt, we're thrilled to have you and thanks so 5 much. 6 CHIEF SABO: Thank you. 7 8 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: All right. It's the end of an 9

era. I get out of this chair. So what I am going to do is let everybody leave that wants to go and do that. Is there cake? I don't know. Maybe. Fingers crossed.

MS. DAWSON: Thank you, Mr. Galloway. Nominations are now open for the position of chairman.

MR. MALCHESKY: I will nominate Mrs. Luhta as the chairman of the Township Board of Trustees for the year 2016.

MR. GALLOWAY: I second that.

MS. DAWSON: All those in favor?

(Three aye votes, no nay votes.)

MS. DAWSON: Nominations are now open for the position of vice chairman for 2016.

MR. GALLOWAY: I nominate Mr. Malchesky as vice

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               MR. GALLOWAY: You be you.

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               CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Oh, because I am soft spoken.
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               MR. GALLOWAY: Yes. I am known to bellow.
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               CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay.
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               MR. MALCHESKY: Second.
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               MR. GALLOWAY: I am told they never have a problem
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     hearing me on the microphone.
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               CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay. We will now set the time
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and date of meetings for 2016. Trustee meetings will be held the first and third Wednesdays of each month at 7:30 p.m. in the Town Hall meeting room. And the office hours will precede the trustee meeting from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. unless otherwise noted. Staff meetings will be set for the Tuesday preceding the first trustee meeting of each month, and the first staff meeting for 2016 was held yesterday. The Appropriations Workshop will be announced at a later date. Special meetings will be announced at least 24 hours in advance on Time Warner Cable Channel 96.2; AT&T U-verse Channel 99; and faxed to the local newspapers, including the News Herald, the Plain Dealer and the Lake County Tribune. Do I hear a motion? MR. MALCHESKY: So I move. MR. GALLOWAY: I second. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: We will now make the department assignments for each trustee as follows: Fire, Mrs. Luhta; Road, Mr. Malchesky; and Zoning, Recreation and special projects, Mr. Galloway. Do I hear a motion? MR. GALLOWAY: I so move. MR. MALCHESKY: Second. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: And we will now appoint the township department directors. Do I hear a motion? MR. GALLOWAY: Yes. I move we approve the following

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township department directors: For Administrator, Kathy 1 Mitchell; legal counsel, Michael Lucas; cemetery sexton, Amy 2 Dawson; Fire Chief, Matthew Sabo; Service Department director, 3 Frank Kraska; Recreation director, Debra Esker; Zoning director 4 and zoning inspector, Bruce Bullard; and secretary to the Board 5 of Zoning Appeals and Zoning Commission, Bruce Bullard. 6 MR. MALCHESKY: Second. 7 8 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 9 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: The employee pay rates for 2016 10 were passed at the special meeting on December 22, 2015. Paul 11 Malchesky had made a motion to approve the rates as discussed, 12 13 Chris Galloway seconded the motion and there were three ayes. We will now establish the legal holidays for the 14 year. If the holiday falls on a Saturday, it is observed on 15 the preceding Friday; on Sunday, it is observed on the 16 following Monday. Do I hear a motion? 17 MR. GALLOWAY: I move we establish legal holidays for 18 19 2016 as follows: The first of these would be for Administration, Service Department and Fire Department 20 21 administrative personnel. First, January 1, New Years Day; 22 January 18th, Martin Luther King, Jr., Day; February 15th, 23 President's Day; March 25th, trustee designated holiday; May 24 30th, Memorial Day; July 4th, Independence Day; September 5th, Labor Day; October 10th, Columbus Day; November 11th, 25 26 Veterans' Day; November 24th, Thanksgiving Day; November 25th, the day after Thanksqiving; December 26th, Christmas Day. 27 28 MR. MALCHESKY: Second.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor?

(Three aye votes, no nay votes.)

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MR. MALCHESKY: I move that we establish the 2016 1 holidays for the Fire Department, Fire Department firefighting 2 personnel as follows: January 1st, New Year's Day; March 27th, 3 Easter Sunday; May 30th, Memorial Day; July 4th, Independence Day; September 5th, Labor Day; November 24th, Thanksgiving Day; 5 December 25th, Christmas Day. 6 MR. GALLOWAY: I will second that. 7 8 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 9 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: We need to establish the mileage rate. Do I hear a motion? MR. GALLOWAY: I move we establish 2016 mileage rate 12 reimbursements per IRS guidelines. As of January 1, 2016, it 13 is 54 cents per mile. 14 MR. MALCHESKY: Second. 15 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 16 17 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: The temporary appropriations for 18 2016 were passed at the regular meeting of December 16, 2015, Resolution 2015-44. Paul Malchesky had made a motion to 20 21 approve the rates as discussed, Chris Galloway seconded the 22 motion and there were three ayes. 23 Approval of blanket certificates. 24 MR. MALCHESKY: I move we accept the list of Super Blanket Certificates, that's 2016-1 through 2016-97, effective 25 26 January 1, 2016, as presented in the list. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: There it is. 27 MR. MALCHESKY: Which is so thick. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Yes. MR. GALLOWAY: Are we signing the top one or are we

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signing all of them? 1 MS. DAWSON: You sign the top one. I sign all them. 2 MR. GALLOWAY: I'll second that motion. 3 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) 5 MR. MALCHESKY: Because of the signature? 6 MR. GALLOWAY: Yes. I didn't know if I needed to do 7 8 an exercise and get ready. MS. DAWSON: No. 9 MR. GALLOWAY: We need to appoint two board members 10 to the Volunteer Fire Fighters' Dependents Fund Board. So I 11 make a motion to elect Paul Malchesky to the Volunteer Fire 12 13 Fighters' Dependents Fund Board to serve a one-year term commencing on January 1, 2016. 14 15 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Second. MR. GALLOWAY: You need to call it. 16 17 MR. MALCHESKY: Oh, call a vote. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: 18 Okav. 19 MR. GALLOWAY: You seconded. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 20 21 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) 22 MR. MALCHESKY: I make a motion to elect Caroline 23 Luhta to the Volunteer Fire Fighters' Dependents Fund Board to 24 serve a one-year term commencing on January 1, 2016. MR. GALLOWAY: I will second that. 25 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 26 27 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) 28 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: And now we appoint the Financial Advisory Committee members. 29 30 MR. GALLOWAY: I move we appoint Fran Wilson to the

Financial Advisory Committee for a two-year term expiring 1 December 31, 2017. 2 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Second. That's what it says. 3 All in favor? 4 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) 5 MR. MALCHESKY: I will table mine. 6 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay. 7 8 MR. GALLOWAY: Very good. I move that we appoint Beverly Vitaz to the Financial Advisory Committee for a 9 two-year term expiring December 31, 2017. 10 MR. MALCHESKY: Second. 11 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: All in favor? 12 13 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: These are all housekeeping items 14 that are critical to operating our township form of government 15 within the legal guidelines set forth by the Ohio Revised Code. 16 17 This concludes the organizational meeting of the -portion of the regular trustees' meeting and we will now move 18 to the remainder of the meeting agenda. 19 And the next item is the approval of minutes of the 20 21 16th and 22nd of December and they are to be tabled. 22 So we move to elected officials' reports. Trustees: 23 Paul, do you have anything? 24 MR. MALCHESKY: I have nothing except that, do you know whether or not our Fireside Chat is running yet? 25 26 MR. GALLOWAY: I don't think it's even been completed 27 yet, putting it together. 28 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Yes. 29 MR. GALLOWAY: That would be some quick turnaround. MR. MALCHESKY: So that --30

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MR. GALLOWAY: You are eager.
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               MR. MALCHESKY: I don't know. I'm just saying. So,
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     I guess, look forward to that, is our opening.
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               MR. GALLOWAY: I assumed we would see it before it
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     was running.
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               MR. MALCHESKY: I didn't assume that.
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               MR. GALLOWAY: Oh, okay. Well, there you go.
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               THE VIDEOGRAPHER: It takes a few days.

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               MR. GALLOWAY: Look at that.
               CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: So we will move to --
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               MR. GALLOWAY: We are on a roll.
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               CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: -- the fiscal officer.
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               MS. DAWSON: Thank you, Mrs. Luhta. Summary of 2015:
     Concord Township continues to be fiscally sound. The Township
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     began 2015 with $6.4 million in the treasury. We've collected
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\$10.8 million in taxes, grants, interest, permit and EMS fees, 1 leases and rents, Community Center classes, cemetery sales, and 2 gifts and donations. We expended \$11.1 million, \$2 million of 3 which was expended on the corridor project, and salaries and 4 benefits, road improvement, road repair and maintenance, 5 emergency services and equipment, property maintenance, fees to 6 Lake County and the State of Ohio and building improvements. 7 In addition, we ended the year with \$369,000 in encumbered 8 funds set aside for specific projects. 9 The Township ended 2015 with \$6.1 million in the 10 treasury in 22 funds, of which \$2.7 million is restricted to 11 the JEDD Fund Number 2905 and the Capital Project Fund 4901. 12 13 One million dollars is required to cover expenses until the first half of real estate taxes arrive at the end of March. 14 Financial statements for Concord Township will be 15 available after March 1st. In the meantime, if you have any 16 questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact my 17 office at the 354-7516. And I hope everybody is having a happy 18 19 and healthy New Year. CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Thank you, Amy. 20 21 Now department reports: Kathy Mitchell, 22 Administrator. 23 MS. MITCHELL: I don't have anything to report. 24 CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay. Fire Chief Sabo. 25 MR. MALCHESKY: He just got here. He's got to report 26 already? 27 CHIEF SABO: Good evening, again. 28 MR. GALLOWAY: I know, right? CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: I hope they save you a piece of 29

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cake.

CHIEF SABO: There is no cake tonight. I mean, we are done with cake for a while.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Oh, okay.

MR. GALLOWAY: Oh, wow, austerity sets in over there. Way to lose the men right out of the gate.

CHIEF SABO: New Years resolutions. Give me a month. So for 2015, we ended the year with 2,277 incidents that we responded to. That's almost 160 runs more than we ran in 2014. For December alone, we ran on 178 total incidents, 9 MVAs, 17 agency assists, 13 fire alarms, 5 calls for wires down, especially during that wind storm that we had towards the end of the year there, beginning of this one, 17 basic rescues, 62 advanced paramedic rescues, 22 public assists, and zero structure fires, so that's good.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Yes.

MR. GALLOWAY: Wow.

Other than our regular safety tip. During the snow season, one needs to consider what it means to the body to engage in snow shoveling. Any person with a history of heart trouble needs to talk to their doctor before taking on this task or any strenuous task.

If you are going to shovel snow, you ought to avoid caffeine and nicotine before beginning, as these are stimulants that may increase your heart rate, causing blood vessels to constrict and putting extra stress on your heart.

Dehydration is just as much an issue in the winter as it is in the summer, so drink plenty of water and dress in layers so that you can remove them as you need to. Make sure you warm up your muscles. They work more efficiently. And use

the right shovel.

When shoveling, protect your back by lifting correctly. Stand with your feet about hip width for balance, keep the shovel close to your body, bend with your knees, not with your back. And most importantly, listen to your body. Stop if you feel any pain and don't hesitate to call 911.

The reason that I chose that as the safety tip this month is, last year and for 2015, we ran -- we responded to eight victims of heart attack. All of them fared well. We did -- They made a full recovery. But we certainly don't want any more statistics added to our numbers. So be safe this winter and drive careful and enjoy the New Year. Thank you.

MR. GALLOWAY: Thanks, Chief.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Thank you.

Service Department, Frank Kraska.

MR. KRASKA: Good evening.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Good evening.

MR. KRASKA: First, I want to say thanks to the Board for endorsing me again for the coming year. I look forward to serving the community. I get great joy from that. So thanks, again.

We were, once again, the beneficiary of the Pacific Ocean El Niño weather pattern which both influenced our precipitation and temperature range in the month of December. As an example, in December of 2014, the daily average temperature was around 41 degrees, as in comparison to in December of 2015, the month just passed, which we saw the daily average climb a whopping 10 degrees higher at 51 degrees on the average.

Both Decembers were fairly equal with light amounts

of precipitation which, for our department, only resulted in only 3 winter-related dispatches in December and, to date, only 7 dispatches from November through Monday of this week. By comparison, if anyone is counting, our department, on January 6, 2015, had already been dispatched on 28 times to plow a year ago and treat roads.

A couple other numbers that speak out are that we have dispensed 280 tons of salt this season, by comparison to 800 tons at this time last year, which is about 65 percent less this season so far.

In the meantime, some of our residents, 81 in total, have taken steps to have the Service Department install snow barricades at their respective residences to protect their mailboxes from the rigors of winter, which we would -- which we could very well still experience, especially with how warm Lake Erie has remained and the potential for lake effect snow. For a material cost of only \$38, this remains a good option for protecting your mailbox and subsequent service. Check out our website for complete information.

The mild whether has enabled us to continue some road maintenance activities, both Dura Patching and pothole repair, at various locations throughout the community.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay. Next is Zoning Department, Bruce Bullard.

MR. BULLARD: Good evening.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Good evening.

MR. BULLARD: Okay. This past month in December, we issued 17 permits, 6 of which were houses. And in reviewing the year, as comparison to last year, we had 344 permits issued total, as opposed to 347 last year. We issued 70 houses in that period of time.

Also, we had a very busy year as far as the Board of Zoning Appeals, where we reviewed five conditional use requests, a use variance was reviewed and 13 variance requests were in front of the Board. We also had six site plan reviews that were reviewed, three of those are currently commercial projects that are in process and there is an additional three that are coming up that are going to be on the Board. New exciting things are happening as far as the commercial operations are going.

And I, too, thank the trustees for their support and, also, the fact that they do send us to education seminars and that is really appreciated by the Zoning Department. Thank you.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Thank you.

MR. GALLOWAY: Thanks, Bruce.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Okay. Debra Esker, Recreation Department.

MS. ESKER: Good evening.

MR. GALLOWAY: Good evening.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Good evening.

MS. ESKER: And I would like to echo the sentiment and thank you for reinstating us. It's such a great family. We love our jobs and it's just a wonderful thing to serve the

residents of Concord.

MR. MALCHESKY: Thanks.

Okay. Next is the Concord law enforcement report and we have -- Lieutenant?

MR. MALCHESKY: Yes.

CHAIRWOMAN LUHTA: Lieutenant Reed. Thank you.

LIEUTENANT REED: Good evening and happy New Year, everyone. I am Lieutenant Reed, from Lake County Sheriff's Office, here to report on December's stats and calls for service for Concord Township area.

We had 1,281 calls for service that were handled in the Concord Township area in December. There was 1 injury

accident, 14 property damage accidents. Arrest wise, we had an adult female arrest on a warrant on State Route 84; we had an adult male arrest for disorderly conduct on Auburn Road; an adult male arrest for disorderly conduct on Crile Road; an adult arrest for disorderly conduct on Auburn Road; an adult male arrest for disorderly conduct on Johnnycake Ridge; an adult male arrest for felony OVI, DUS and no Ohio license on State Route 84; an adult male arrest for a TPO violation, resisting arrest and warrants on Country Scene; we had two adult male arrests for discharging fireworks and disorderly conduct on Excaliber; and we had an adult male arrest for OVI on Morley Road at Pinehill.

We handled 70 alarms. There were 224 business checks, 291 crime prevention checks. We issued 25 citations in Concord, 118 written warnings. We handled 1 driving under suspension, 3 operating a vehicle while intoxicated.

And new investigations include an assault on Auburn Road, a B and E to a vehicle on Melridge a B and E to a vehicle on Johnnycake Ridge, a burglary on Mountain Park, a bad checks complaint on Johnnycake Ridge, a drugs complaint on Rio Vista, a sex offense on Morley Road, we had a theft on North Excaliber, a theft at Ellison Creek, a theft on Johnnycake Ridge, a theft on North Downy Place, a theft on Auburn Road, two thefts on Country Scene, another theft on Auburn Road, a theft on Braintree Lane, a theft on Cherry Hill, a theft at Auburn Road, a theft on Discovery Lane, a theft on Hunting Lake, a theft on Stonehedge, a theft on Johnnycake Ridge, a theft report at Fredle Drive, a theft report at Barchester. And that's all the theft reports for the month.

MR. GALLOWAY: Wow.

LIEUTENANT REED: Threats on Auburn Road --

MR. MALCHESKY: That's enough.

Mr. GALLOWAY: Apparently, people are not in the giving spirit, the taking spirit.

LIEUTENANT REED: Yeah. Well, it's a lot of car break-ins and we had some thefts of Christmas ornaments and things this year. The new star lights that everybody had were a popular item. At \$40 a piece, they were a quick grab and an easy thing to sell for resale.

We had a threats report on Auburn Road, a threats on Lancaster Court, a threat report on Chestnut, a threat report on Johnnycake Ridge. We had a vandalism on North Galahad Place, a vandalism at North Point Court, a vandalism on Nobhill Lane, a vandalism on Ravenna Road, a vandalism on Village Drive, a vandalism on Augusta Lane, and we handled a stolen vehicle on Old Johnnycake Road. That's all I have to report on that.

Deen pretty fortunate so far as far as accidents and DAVs.

But the bad weather is coming, so I would say adjust your travel time accordingly and make sure you leave yourself good stopping distance before other cars. And don't forgot to pack up some safety supplies, maybe an extra blanket and a couple waters when you know you are going to be traveling so that, in case you do get stranded, you are able to stay safe until someone can get there to help you.
