**NEW BUSINESS:**

- A. SERVICE DEPT.: RESOLUTION 2017-09 AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE ODOT WINTER CONTRACT (018-18) FOR ROAD SALT. Mrs. Luhta moved to approve the following Resolution authorizing participation in the ODOT winter contract:

**RESOLUTION 2017-09**

***Authorizing Participation  
in the ODOT Winter Contract (018-18) for Road Salt***

**WHEREAS**, the **Concord Township, Lake County** (hereinafter referred to as the "Political Subdivision") hereby submits this written agreement to participate in the Ohio Department of Transportation's (ODOT) annual winter road salt bid (018-18) in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 5513.01(B) and hereby agrees to all of the following terms and conditions in its participation of the ODOT winter road salt contract:

- a. The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to be bound by all terms and conditions established by ODOT in the winter road salt contract and acknowledges that upon award of the contract by the Director of ODOT it shall be bound by all such terms and conditions included in the contract; and
- b. The Political Subdivision hereby acknowledges that upon the Director of ODOT's signing of the winter road salt contract, it shall effectively form a contract between the awarded salt supplier and the Political Subdivision; and
- c. The Political Subdivision agrees to be solely responsible for resolving all claims or disputes arising out of its participation in the ODOT winter road salt contract and agrees to hold the Department of Transportation harmless for any claims, actions, expenses, or other damages arising out of the Political Subdivision's participation in the winter road salt contract; and
- d. The Political Subdivision hereby requests through this participation agreement a total of **2,600 tons** of Sodium Chloride (Road Salt) of which the Political Subdivision agrees to purchase from its awarded salt supplier at the delivered bid price per ton awarded by the Director of ODOT; and
- e. The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to purchase a minimum of 90% of its above-requested salt quantities from its awarded salt supplier during the contract's effective period of October 1, 2017 through April 30, 2018; and
- f. The Political Subdivision hereby agrees to place orders with and directly pay the awarded salt supplier on a net 30 basis for all road salt it receives pursuant to ODOT winter salt contract; and

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g. The Political Subdivision acknowledges that should it wish to rescind this participation agreement it will do so by written, emailed request by no later than Thursday, June 1, 2017. The written, emailed request to rescind this participation agreement must be received by the ODOT Office of Contract Sales, Purchasing Section email: [Contracts.Purchasing@dot.ohio.gov](mailto:Contracts.Purchasing@dot.ohio.gov) by the deadline. The Department, upon receipt, will respond that it has received the request and that it has effectively removed the Political Subdivision's participation request. Furthermore, it is the sole responsibility of the Political Subdivision to ensure ODOT has received this participation agreement as well as the receipt of any request to rescind this participation agreement. The Department shall not be held responsible or liable for failure to receive a Political Subdivision's participation agreement and/or a Political Subdivision's request to rescind its participation agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the following authorized person(s) that this participation agreement for the ODOT winter road salt contract is hereby approved, funding has been authorized, and the Political Subdivision agrees to the above terms and conditions regarding participation on the ODOT winter salt contract:

- B. ZONING DEPT.: RESOLUTION # 2017-10 INITIATING ZONING TEXT AMENDMENTS TO ESTABLISH THE INNOVATE SITE/PD OVERLAY DISTRICT WITH CORRESPONDING ZONING MAP UPDATE. Mrs. Luhta moved to approve the following Resolution:

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017-10**

**A Resolution by the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, Ohio, of Its Intention to Establish Section Xxi The Innovative Site/Pd Overlay District Under the Concord Township Zoning Resolution, And Provide For All Text and Map Amendments Necessary Thereto.**

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code Section 519.12(A) authorizes the Board of Trustees to initiate any amendments to the Township Zoning Resolution by certifying the subject amendment to the Township Zoning Commission for public hearing on the same; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, Ohio believes that it would be in the best interest of the Township and its inhabitants to establish Section XXI, the Innovative Site/PD Overlay District within the Concord Township Zoning Resolution and to provide for all text and zoning map amendments necessary thereto;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, County of Lake, and State of Ohio that:

**Section 1.** This Board of Trustees declares its intention to certify the below set forth amendments to the Concord Township Zoning Commission and thereby establish Section XXI, the Innovative Site/PD Overlay District, within the Concord Township Zoning Resolution for public hearing on the same and as follows:

Amend the Zoning Resolution to establish The Innovative Site/PD Overlay District as a planned development in Section XXI, in a form substantially similar to annexed Exhibit A, incorporated herein, and other ancillary amendments related thereto within existing Sections XIII, XXII, XXXVII, and XXXVIII, respectively, of the Township Zoning Resolution.

Amend the Zoning Map to rezone the following presently designated parcel numbers to include the Innovative Site/PD Overlay District: 08-A-020-0-00-027-0, 08-A-020-0-00-022-0, 08A-020-0-00-026-0, 08-A-020-0-00-020-0, 08-A-020-0-00-006-0, 08-A-020-0-00-021-0, 08-A-020-0-00-007-0, 08LLA-020-0-00-035-0, 08-A-777-0-00-028-0, 08-a-020-a-00-001-0, 08-A-020-A-00-010-0, 08-A-777-0-00-027-0, 08A-020-A-00-015-0, 08-A-020-A-00-014-0, 08-A-020-A-00-008-0, 08-A-020-A-00-013-0, 08-A-020-A-00-005-0, 08-A-777-0-00-029-0, 08-A-020-0-00-036-0, and 08-A-020-0-00-005-0, inclusive, in a form substantially similar to annexed Exhibit B, incorporated herein.

**Section 2.** All formal actions of this Board of Trustees concerning the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Board of Trustees or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code. Mr. Galloway seconded. Vote: 2 ayes.

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- c. RESOLUTION #2017-11 MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH CITY OF PAINESVILLE FOR AUBURN ROAD WATER LINE UPGRADE. Mrs. Luhta moved to approve the following Resolution:

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

**THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** by and between the **CITY OF PAINESVILLE, OHIO**, an Ohio municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "the City," and **CONCORD TOWNSHIP, OHIO**, an Ohio township, hereinafter referred to as "the Township," and both parties together hereinafter referred to as "the Parties," shall be effective as of April \_\_\_\_\_, 2017. This document is understood to be an expression of the intent of the Parties to attempt in good faith to negotiate and reach binding agreements on the matters discussed herein, and it is not a contract or an otherwise legally binding instrument.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Township, by Resolution No. 2008-37, passed on August 20, 2008, and the City, by Ordinance No. 49-08, passed on August 21, 2008, each approved the creation of and the execution of the Concord Township – City of Painesville Joint Economic Development District Contract (the "JEDD Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that key priorities for managing the City and the Township include the development and maintenance of public infrastructure, including without limitation, safety and utility infrastructure, which priorities will be furthered by entering into this Memorandum; and

WHEREAS, the JEDD Contract in part provided income tax revenue to the Parties with such revenue paid or credited to the Parties to be used by the City and the Township to encourage and promote economic development, including but not limited to maintaining and improving the utility infrastructure of the facilities of both the City and the Township; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the sufficiency of which are acknowledged by the parties hereto, the City and the Township shall continue to pursue good faith discussions and negotiations as necessary to finalize any additional agreements and written documentation to effectuate the following agreed terms and provisions set forth as follows.

**Section 1. Duties of the City.**

The City shall undertake the following responsibilities:

- (i) The City shall, at its own cost and expense, implement, and undertake the construction of the Crile Road/Auburn Road Waterline Improvement, Project Number 17-006, and further described as the installation of approximately 1700 LF of ductile iron pipe waterline and associated appurtenances with pavement repair (the "Water Line"), with all work to be done within the existing right-of-ways.
- (ii) The City agrees that the installation of the Water Line shall be completed during the calendar year 2017.

**Section 2. Duties of the Township.**

The Township shall undertake the following responsibilities:

- (i) The Township shall use JEDD revenues received by the Township (or JEDD Revenues contributed to the Township by the JEDD) to assist the City for the cost of the Water Line by timely contribution of Seventy Three Thousand Dollars (\$73,000.00) to the City.

**Section 3. Term of Memorandum.** This Memorandum shall become effective upon its execution and shall continue in effect until full and final completion of any and all necessary actions by the City to install the Water Line, or December 31, 2017, whichever event occurs earlier in point of time.

**Section 4. Notices.** All notices or other correspondence relating to this Memorandum must be in writing (including e-mail or facsimile) and must be delivered or sent guaranteed overnight delivery, by facsimile or e-mail (to be followed by personal or overnight guaranteed delivery, if requested) or by postage prepaid registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, and will be deemed to be given for purposes of this Memorandum on the date such writing is received

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by the intended recipient. Unless otherwise specified in a notice sent in accordance with this section, all communications in writing must be given to the parties at the following addresses:

Section 5. Successors; Assignment; Amendments, Changes and Modifications. This Memorandum will be binding upon the Township and its successors and assigns and the City and its successors and assigns. The Parties may assign this Memorandum. This Memorandum may only be amended by written instrument executed by all parties to this Memorandum.

Section 6. Extent of Covenants; No Personal Liability. All covenants, stipulations, obligations and agreements of the parties contained in this Memorandum are effective and enforceable to the extent authorized and permitted by applicable law. The obligations of the Township or the City may be enforced to the extent permitted by law by mandamus or any suit or proceeding in law or equity. No such covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement will be deemed a covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement of any present or future member, officer, agent, or employee of any of the Parties hereto in their individual capacity.

Section 7. Severability. If any provision of this Memorandum, or any covenant, obligation or agreement contained herein is determined by a court to be invalid or unenforceable, that determination shall not affect any other provision, covenant, obligation or agreement, each of which shall be construed and enforced as if the invalid or unenforceable portion were not contained herein. That invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any valid and enforceable application thereof, and each such provision, covenant, obligation or agreement shall be deemed to be effective, operative, made, entered into or taken in the manner and to the full extent permitted by law. Furthermore, in lieu of such invalid or unenforceable provision, there will be added automatically as a part of this Memorandum a provision as similar in terms to such invalid or unenforceable provision as may be possible that is and will be valid and enforceable.

Section 8. Separate Counterparts. This Memorandum may be executed by the Parties hereto in separate counterparts, each of which when so executed and delivered will be an original, but all such counterparts will together constitute one and the same instrument. It shall not be necessary in proving this Memorandum to produce or account for more than one of those counterparts.

Section 9. Merger and Amendment. This Memorandum supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the Parties hereto with respect to the Water Line and contains all of the covenants, agreements, and other terms and conditions between the parties hereto with respect to the same. No waivers, alterations or modifications of this Memorandum or any agreements in connection therewith shall be valid unless in writing and duly executed by all parties hereto. Any substantial waivers, alterations, or modifications of this Memorandum will require the adoption of legislation by the Board of Trustees of the Township and the Council of the City.

Section 10. Governing Law and Choice of Forum. This Memorandum will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio. All claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question between the Hospital, its agents and employees, the Township, its agents and employees, and the City, its agents and employees, arising out of or relating to this Memorandum shall be heard by the Court of Common Pleas for Lake County, Ohio which shall have exclusive jurisdiction. Mr. Galloway seconded. Vote: 2 ayes.

- C. P.O. #37-2017 AUBURN ROAD WATER LINE COST: \$73,000. Mrs. Luhta moved to approve the Purchase Order #37-2017 to City of Painesville, 7 Richmond Street Painesville, OH, for the amount of \$73,000. Mr. Galloway seconded. Vote: 2 ayes.
- D. RESOLUTION 2017-12 DECLARING TWO (2) CRE100 STONE CHIPPER BOXES AS NOT NEEDED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSE AND OBSOLETE, APPROVING THE SALE TO CHARDON TOWNSHIP. Mrs. Luhta moved to approve the following Resolution:

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**RESOLUTION 2017-12**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING TWO (2) CRE100 STONE CHIPPER BOXES OF THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP SERVICE DEPARTMENT AS NOT NEEDED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSE AND OBSOLETE, APPROVING THE SALE OF THE TWO (2) STONE CHIPPER BOXES TO THE TOWNSHIP OF CHARDON WITHOUT ADVERTISEMENT OR BIDDING, AND AUTHORIZING THE BOARD CHAIRMAN TO EXECUTE TRANSFER AND CONVEY OWNERSHIP AND ANY NECESSARY CONTRACT OR DOCUMENTS RELATED THERETO.**

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code Section 505.10(A) provides that when a Township has property, including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, and tools, and the Board, by resolution, finds is not needed for public use, is obsolete or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired, the Board may sell and convey that property or otherwise dispose of it in accordance with this Section of the Ohio Revised Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code Section 505.101 provides that the Board of Trustees may, by resolution, enter into a contract, without advertising or bidding, for the sale of materials, equipment, or supplies to any department, agency or political subdivision of the State; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township owns the following (2) pieces of equipment that are not needed for the use for which they were acquired and are obsolete, and the Board desires to sell the same; to wit: (2) stone chipper boxes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Chardon in Geauga County, Ohio, desires to purchase the foregoing equipment for the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), with such purchase price to be allocated for the two (2) surplus pieces of equipment as follows: stone chipper boxes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Concord Township Board of Trustees finds that the purchase price in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the two (2) herein identified Concord Township Service Department pieces of equipment is fair and reasonable;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, Lake County, Ohio that:

**Section 1.** That the Board of Trustees for Concord Township does hereby find and determine in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 505.10(A) that the following (2) Concord Township Service Department pieces of equipment are unfit for the use for which they were acquired and obsolete; to wit, stone chipper boxes;

**Section 2.** That the Concord Township Board of Trustees does hereby approve the sale of the herein identified Concord Township Service Department equipment, without advertising or bidding, to the Township of Chardon in the purchase price of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00);

**Section 3.** That the Concord Township Board of Trustees does hereby authorize Paul R. Malchesky, as Chairman of the Board of Concord Township Trustees, to execute any and all agreements and contracts necessary to formalize the validity and implementation of this sale to transfer and convey the herein described two (2) pieces of equipment to the Township of Chardon without further delay.

**Section 4.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in those formal actions were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.  
NOW, THEREFORE, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Board of Trustees and as further provided under Ohio law. Mr. Galloway seconded. Vote: 2 ayes.

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
