Following the completion of the water line upgrade, which should take no more than two more weeks, if not sooner, then the Lake County Engineer's Office will proceed with the repaving of Auburn Road underneath the bridge which, again, I think will be a welcome change. I know a lot of residents have been asking for that for quite some time.

And, lastly, we have received a number of calls regarding when our shredding, annual shredding day will be. We have finally scheduled that and will have that on the website, posted in the Grapevine. That will be Saturday, September 9th,

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from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. here at Concord Town Hall. Again, there are some restrictions with, you know, different items you can bring. You can bring up to three boxes. It's the same company we've used in the past, North Coast Shredding, same procedures. And we will put this all on the website for those that are interested. That's all I have.

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CHAIRMAN MALCHESKY: Okay. Thank you. That brings us to audience portion. We have some new individuals in the audience. So I just remind everyone that if you're going to make a comment, come up to the podium, tell us your name and address, and thank you.

MR. MARLOWE: Hello. I'm Tim Marlowe. I live at 7372 Hunting Lake Drive. First, I want to acknowledge the members of the Fire Department that were here. I believe that's a mistake. I've spoken to many different residents and they seem supportive of that same idea, that it is a mistake.

We would like you to consider taking that portion out of the zoning so that it's -- you are just going forward with commercial and not with residential.
