Today is Wednesday, June 20. I am going to call to order the public hearing for the Zoning Amendment Application Number 0318-3 by 44 Partnership requesting to rezone 3.4864 acres of land on Crile Road from R-2, Planned Unit Development to BX, Business Interchange. You both have the applicable paperwork, application, et cetera, in front of you, as well as correspondence from Mrs. Freeman as it relates to the recommendation from the Zoning Commission.

I would note that this was a chain that -- change that was unanimously approved by the Lake County Planning Commission and then subsequently the Concord Township Zoning Commission as well.

Because this is a public hearing, I would open it up to the public to see if there is any comment as it's related to this zoning amendment application.

Do the Trustees have any questions or comments that they would like to make during this public hearing on this matter, being that there is no public here to speak to it?

MS. LUHTA: I have no comments.

MR. MALCHESKY: Did the applicant always own this property or just recently acquired it?

MR. GIORGI: Ten years, we've had it.

MR. MALCHESKY: Okay. That's it. That's the only question I've got.

CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. Well, that's the easiest public hearing you will ever be involved with. Being that there is no public, I am going to go ahead and close the public hearing.

(Whereupon, the public hearing was closed at 1 7:19 p.m. and there was a recess until 7:31 p.m. 2 when the regular meeting was called to order.) 3 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. I am going to call to 5 order the regularly scheduled Concord Township Board of Trustees meeting for Wednesday, June 20th. Please join 6 Mr. Giorgi in the Pledge of Allegiance. 7 8 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.) 9 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Thank you, Mark. I put you on the spot there. 10 Let's have a roll call. 11 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Malchesky? 12 13 MR. MALCHESKY: Present. MS. DAWSON: Mrs. Luhta? 14 MS. LUHTA: Here? 15 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Galloway? 16 17 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I am here. Minute approval. Do you, either of you, have any 18 changes or modifications to the June 6th minutes? 19 MS. LUHTA: No. 20 21 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I do have just one item under 22 Section D, Number 3. I just think we should put the word 23 "the" Bobcat in before the two -- the second and third line 24 where it says "Bobcat" so that someone doesn't confuse it for an individual. 25 26 MS. DAWSON: Oh, to --27 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: A small grammar thing, that's 28 all. MS. DAWSON: No, no, okay. 29 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: So "to the Bobcat," and then on 30

the third line "breaker to the Bobcat." 1 2 MS. LUHTA: Oh, okay. MS. DAWSON: Okay. Got it. 3 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: That's all I have. 5 approved with that, with that mod --MS. DAWSON: As amended. 6 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: As amended. 7 8 Elected official reports. Fiscal Officer, 9 Mrs. Dawson. 10 MS. DAWSON: I have no report. CHAIRMAN MALCHESKY: Okay. Mr. Malchesky? 11 MR. MALCHESKY: I have nothing to report. 12 13 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Mrs. Luhta? MS. LUHTA: No report. 14 15 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. Well, I'll just keep that party going and say I have no report. 16 17 Mr. Rose, Administrator's report. MR. ROSE: Thank you, Mr. Galloway, members of the 18 19 Board, Mrs. Dawson. Road repairs on Mount Royal Subdivision 20 will begin next week. We are currently reviewing properties 21 for inclusion in the next round of TIFs. We continue to work 22 closely with Lake County Stormwater on various projects. On 23 that stormwater note, the outfall repair for the detention 24 pond at Country Scene will be going out for bid on June 29th. 25 And to end on a great note, we are inviting everybody to come 26 and join us for the kick-off of the Summer Concert Series 27 tomorrow at the gazebo. The concert starts at 7:00 and we 28 look forward to seeing everyone. Thank you, sir. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: 29 Thank you. 30 Okay. Audience, anyone in the audience wish to

bring anything before the Board? Nobody does. 1 2 Old Business, there is no Old Business. That brings us to Item A and that is we have to make 3 a decision on the public hearing from earlier this evening, 4 5 and this is the Zoning Amendment Application 0318-3 by 44 Partnership requesting a rezone of 3.4864 acres of land on 6 Crile Road from R-2, Planned Unit Development to BX, Business 7 8 Interchange. 9 I would ask the applicant if he would like to say anything at all. You are not required to. 10 MR. GIORGI: Any questions? 11 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: We will give you, afford you 12 13 that opportunity if you, if you wish. 14 Do I have a motion as it relates to that matter? 15 MR. MALCHESKY: So moved. MS. LUHTA: Second. 16 17 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. And that motion is to, is to --18 19 MS. LUHTA: Approve. MR. MALCHESKY: The motion is in the affirmative for 20 21 the approval of the amendment of Application Number 0318-3 by 22 44 Partnership requesting a rezone of 3.46 -- 3.4864 acres of 23 land on Crile Road from R-2, Planned Unit Development to BX, 24 Business Interchange. 25 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. 26 MR. MALCHESKY: I just need a second. 27 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Yep. 28 MS. LUHTA: You got it. MS. DAWSON: She did. 29 30 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: And then I would just note for

the record that that is Parcel Number 08-A-021-0-00-082-0. 1 2 Any further discussion on that matter? MR. MALCHESKY: None. 3 MS. LUHTA: No. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: All those in favor? 5 (Three aye votes, no nay votes.) 6 MS. LUHTA: Okay. 7 8 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. The next thing we have 9 is a purchase agreement for property, real property at 10 11622 Concord-Hambden Road in the amount of \$100,750. MS. LUHTA: I move that we make that purchase. 11 12 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I will second that. And for 13 those who are at home wondering what this is, this is property adjacent to Concord Town Hall Campus to the east, southeast of 14 15 the Fire Station 1. We will be purchasing two individual parcels this evening, if we vote in the affirmative, that is. 16 17 MS. LUHTA: That's right. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Paul, do you have any other 18 19 comment on that? MR. MALCHESKY: I do not. 20 21 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. Let me have a roll call 22 vote on that, Mrs. Dawson. 23 MS. DAWSON: Okay. Mr. Galloway? 24 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Yes. 25 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Malchesky? 26 MR. MALCHESKY: Yes. MS. DAWSON: Mrs. Luhta? 27 28 MS. LUHTA: Yes. Subsequently, we have 29 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Resolution 2018-19, which is a purchase agreement for 30

11636 Concord-Hambden Road in Concord Township for the amount 1 of \$89,000. 2 MR. MALCHESKY: So moved. 3 MS. LUHTA: Second. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Any discussion? 5 MR. MALCHESKY: This is the property right next door 6 7 to it, so fairly simple. 8 MS. LUHTA: Yep. Something we've been wanting for a 9 long time. It's now within a reasonable price. 10 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: That is correct. And I will go ahead and ask for a roll call vote on that purchase. 11 MS. DAWSON: Mr. Malchesky? 12 13 MR. MALCHESKY: Yes. MS. DAWSON: Mrs. Luhta? 14 15 MS. LUHTA: Yes. MS. DAWSON: Mr. Galloway? 16 17 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Yes. Okay. Those are acquired. Just so the folks at home know, the plan is to, at some point, 18 19 work into the budget removal of those existing houses and incorporate that property fully into the Town Hall Campus and 20 21 with a usage that will be determined as we work on our overall 22 Master Plan for Town Hall Campus. Right now, we are just busy 23 signing everything. MR. MALCHESKY: I will make a motion to make Susan 24 Germovsek a Zoning Commission regular, as she will fill the 25 26 remainder of Gerard Morgan's term effective June 20, 2018, 27 ending March 31st of 2022. 28 MS. LUHTA: I will second that with pleasure. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: We had a resignation from the 29 Zoning Commission. Mrs. Germovsek is currently serving as an 30

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alternate and she has volunteered to fill the remainder of
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    that term and I think a great choice for that.

MALCHESKY: The Summer Concert Series are 9 canceled by 6:00 p.m. if there is inclement weather and a sign will be posted at the gazebo and also on Facebook. 10 With that being said, the first one will be 11 Thursday, June 21st, which is tomorrow, at 7:00 p.m. in, 12 13 again, in the gazebo and it will be the 730 Band, cover tunes; Again, on June 28th, at 7:00 p.m., you will have the 14 15 Chardon Polka Band; On Saturday, June 30th, from 3:00 to 5:00, at Old 16 17 Stone Schoolhouse, we'll have the scavenger hunt; On July 3rd, we will cancel our staff meeting that 18 19 day; on July 3rd, at 7:00 p.m., the Zoning Commission meeting. Still going to be held? 20 MS. LUHTA: Maybe not. 21 22 MS. FREEMAN: As of right now, yes. 23 MR. MALCHESKY: As of right now, it will still be 24 held but, again, it's the day before the 4th. So --We will be closed on the 4th of July; 25 26 Wednesday, July 11th, at 7:00 p.m., we will have the 27 BZA meeting in Town Hall; 28 On Thursday, July 12th, the Summer Concert Series will be Custard Pie, rock and roll; 29 30 And then we will have our staff meeting on

Wednesday, at 5:30, on July 18th, and our regular Trustees' 1 2 meeting at 7:30. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okav. 3 MR. MALCHESKY: Chris, would you like to set 5 anything else? CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: I certainly would. Thank you, 6 Paul, for taking care of all that. 7 8 I would ask the Board if we can go ahead and set a public hearing for 7:15 p.m. on Wednesday, July 18th. 9 10 this would be a public hearing regarding enactment of a township permissive motor vehicle license tax. 11 12 MS. LUHTA: At 7:15? 13 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: At 7:15 on the 18th. 14 MS. LUHTA: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: And then, subsequently, on July 25th, at 7:15 -- I am sorry -- 7:00, 7:00 p.m., we will 16 17 have to schedule a public hearing and a special meeting, if that's okay with you. 18 19 MR. MALCHESKY: I'd love to. 20 CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Both of you. So let's do the 21 public hearing, the second public hearing as it relates to the 22 enactment of a township permissive motor vehicle license. 23 then -- So the public hearing at 7:00 and then we will do our 24 special meeting, Andy, at 7:15 or at the closure of the public hearing if it goes beyond 7:15. 25 26 MR. ROSE: Yes, sir. CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: Okay. 27 28 MR. MALCHESKY: Anything else? CHAIRMAN GALLOWAY: That's all I got. Does anybody 29 else have anything else? Legal counsel? 30
