TRUSTEE'S CORNER

The Concord Township Trustees hope that residents have enjoyed a healthy and safe summer. First off, we wish to thank our Concord Garden Club for the wonderful job they have done in maintaining our Township Hall landscaping beds. A great deal of hard work goes into keeping them beautiful. As everyone who visited Town Hall this spring and summer can attest, the flowers and other plantings around the building and gazebo are stunning. Thank you Concord Garden Club for your hard work! Our Service Department is working diligently to keep up with scheduled road repairs and we have remained on schedule during this construction season. One major event taking place is the widening of the Crile-Auburn intersection and the Crile-Capital Parkway intersection. This necessary work was added to the project due to safety concerns with larger trucks making the turns. We are hopeful this will be the last remaining piece to the intersection.



Speaking of construction, as of this writing, the Subway is completed, Chipotle is near completion and the Holiday Inn Express on Gold Court is under construction now. It is exciting to see new businesses coming to the Township. We regularly receive inquiries regarding "local business" and why we permit national chains to develop here. FINANCIAL UPDATE

Through the middle of August, we have received \$6.7 million in revenue, or 62% of the 2018 budgeted revenue. Expenditures total \$6.4 million – 49% of the 2018 budgeted expenditures. We currently have \$5.3 million in the total Treasury. We have already received substantially all of our tax settlement proceeds for 2018 and will need \$2.5 million of that balance for specific projects and as a comfortable carryover from 2018 to 2019, since we will not receive our funding until March.

CEMETERY UPDATE

We are currently researching participation in the program, Wreaths across America. This national nonprofit organization has a mission to Remember, Honor and Teach. Remember the fallen. Honor those who served and their families. Teach future generations about the sacrifices

made to preserve our freedom. We have had several requests from residents in the past to participate. This year's wreath-laying ceremony is slated for December 15, 2018 at noon. DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF RON TERRIACO RECEIVES 2018 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

On July 15, 2018, the Ohio Fire Chiefs' Association presented Deputy Chief Ron Terriaco with their 2018 Distinguished Service Award, honoring his dedication, service and leadership within the Association and within the fire service in Ohio and at the national level. Deputy Chief Terriaco is passionate about keeping firefighters safe and ensuring "Everyone Goes Home". He travels the state teaching the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation program of 16 Firefighter Life Safety Initiatives. Deputy Chief Terriaco is a leader in Ohio representing the National Fallen Firefighter's Foundation's Local Assistance State Team (LAST) Team. The Team provides a multitude of services to families, including support with funeral plans and ongoing assistance with benefits following line of duty death.

Deputy Chief Terriaco began his fire service career as a part time firefighter EMT basic with Concord Township in 1982 and worked his way through the ranks obtaining his Deputy Chief position in 2009. He is a designated Ohio Fire Chief Officer. He is past president of the Lake County Fire Chief's Association, has served as lead instructor at Auburn Career Center and a member of Lake County's East End Fire Investigation Unit. For Concord Township, Deputy Chief Terriaco oversees fire service operations and heads up the Fire Prevention Bureau. He works intensely with contractors on new builds and with business owners on maintaining fire safety in existing commercial businesses.

Deputy Chief Terriaco has a lifelong connection with the fire service. His father, Richard Terriaco, joined Concord Township Fire Department in 1976 and served as Fire Chief from 1984-1995. His mother, Henrietta, was a longtime supporter of the

ROADSIDE DITCHES – Purpose & Benefits

Developments, which have been constructed in Concord Township that include roadside ditch design, have obvious benefits as related to its particular specification. Roadside ditches primarily provide far greater capacity for rainwater storage and snowmelt than an enclosed pipe system. Rainwater runoff from roadways into the roadside ditch helps to keep the roads passable during significant weather events. The vegetation lining most ditches ensures better water quality



by trapping sediment, pollutants and contaminants carried by storm water before discharging into streams, wetlands and ultimately Lake Erie. Concord Township Service Department upon request will excavate and regrade sections of roadside ditch to ensure optimum performance. Remember that we are all caretakers of our local environment and we need to recognize something as simple as a roadside ditch and how it is quietly performing a function that improves the quality of our local water resources.

BRUSH DROP-OFF PROGRAM

Concord Township Service Department will provide an opportunity for Concord residents to drop off brush and yard waste on two Saturdays this fall, September 22nd and October 13th, from 8:00am-2:00pm. Service department employees will be on hand to assist residents in the off loading of materials at our service garage located at 7229 Ravenna Road right behind the Town Hall. Limbs, twigs and branches (4) inches in diameter or less will be accepted. Yard waste will be accepted in biodegradable bags or easily handled containers that can be dumped by hand, no plastic bags please. Brush is chipped and made available to the residents for pickup during regular business hours Monday through Friday.

ANNUAL LEAF COLLECTION

The annual leaf pick-up service for residents will be conducted the week of November 26th. Residents will be required to supply their own biodegradable leaf bags. After the

bags have been filled with leaves only, they should be placed at the curbside where our vendor will pick them up. Only bagged leaves in biodegradable bags will be picked up. No bulk leaves, piled leaves or leaves in plastic bags will be accepted. The collection will begin at 6:00 am the morning of Monday November 26th and there will be no returns to pick up bags that were not at the curb when collections begin. This service normally takes three to four days to complete, so thank you for your patience during this pick-up.



MAILBOX SNOW BARRICADES

The Service Department will provide the labor to install snow barricades for residents of Concord Township at no charge. The barricade consists of an aluminum board, two steel posts, reflective numbers and hardware. The material must be purchased from Concord Township at the cost of \$40.00.

These barricades help to absorb the impact of heavy snow being discharged by the snow plows. Please keep in mind that this barricade is not a guarantee that your mailbox will not be damaged during the course of the winter season. If you are interested in having the Service Department install a snow barricade, the form can be easily found on the home page of our website at www.concordtwp.com or please stop by Town Hall and fill out an installation form during regular office hours. Once the form is complete and the material reimbursement is submitted, we will schedule the installation. This will be a onetime installation and all maintenance thereafter is the responsibility of the resident.

Zoning was initially adopted by the Concord Township Trustees in 1955. Zoning provides a legal means of carrying out a responsible plan for physical growth and development by designating districts which provide for the orderly use of residential, commercial, and industrial areas. By encouraging the most appropriate use of lands, zoning helps to protect property value and maintain the highest and best use for all properties.

The objectives of the zoning department are to serve the community as a whole by promoting public health, safety, and morals through orderly comprehensive development of the community. The Zoning Inspector enforces the Zoning Resolution, while the Zoning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals both play important roles in the zoning process. The following information briefly outlines the roles and responsibilities of the two zoning boards.

The Zoning Commission consists of five members and two alternates that are appointed by the Trustees. The Board serves in an advisory capacity to the Board of Trustees on matters concerning amendments to the Zoning Resolution and the Zoning Map. In addition, the Zoning Commission reviews applications for Site Plan Review for commercial, non-residential uses, and multi-family projects proposed within the Township. The Commission meets the first Tuesday of every month at Township Hall at 7:00 p.m. Agendas are posted on the website a week prior to a meeting. The Zoning Commission is always looking for citizen input, and welcomes residents to their meetings to discuss zoning related topics.

The Board of Zoning Appeals consists of five members and

two alternates appointed by the Trustees. Their function is to act upon requests for variances, grant conditional use permits, and review appeals from administrative decisions. They meet the second Wednesday of every month unless there are no cases to be reviewed. The meetings take place at 7:00 p.m. at Township Hall. Agendas are posted on the website a week prior to a meeting.

Zoning meetings can be viewed live on cable stations Channel 99 (AT&T U-verse) or Channel 1020 (Spectrum). In addition, all meeting videos are archived on the Township's YouTube channel. Go to concordtwp.com and click the YouTube link at the top of the page, or Search Concord Township, Lake County, Ohio and subscribe to our channel.


