## DO I NEED TO FILE A PERMIT TO BUILD A FENCE?

Thinking of constructing a fence? Here is everything you need to know about filing for a permit. Concord Township requires that the homeowner or contractor file for a zoning permit for the job. This permit is to ensure that your fence design, size, scale and material, are built to code and approved by the township. Permits are really another way to make sure that structures are safe for the public and adhere to current standards and practices.

### Do I really need a fence permit?

Yes, a zoning permit is required for new fences in all residential zoning districts, except as otherwise noted. Fencing proposed for agricultural uses, such as enclosures for horses, are exempt and do not require a permit. Additionally, small portions of fences, such as decorative fencing, that are not longer than 20 feet in length, but which comply with the height and maintenance requirements, do not require a zoning permit.

### What are the requirements for fences?

Fences in front yards shall not exceed four (4) feet in height. Fences located in the side or rear yards up to the front edge of the building shall not exceed a height of eight (8) feet. The smooth finished side of the fence shall face outward from the yard being fenced, and any horizontal, diagonal, or supporting members shall be on the interior side of the fence. Fences need to be maintained in good condition without any advertising, and should not obstruct visibility.

### How do I file for a fence permit?

In order to file for your fence permit, a site plan or drawing must be submitted showing the proposed location of the fence in relationship to your property lines. The Zoning department may be able to provide you with a site plan for your use, or you may hire a surveyor to prepare your site plan. A survey is not a requirement of the township, however it is the responsibility of the property owner to verify the property lines. Details about the type of fence, including height, length and location must also be provided at the time of application. The zoning permit application may be found on the Township website or may be filled out at the Zoning office.

The Service Department helped usher in the spring of 2019 on April 26th by paying tribute to Arbor Day for the third straight year. We once again contributed to Concord Townships environmental well-being by having a tree planting ceremony on Arbor Day. Trees are vital from the air that we breathe to the shade that provides cooling on hot summer days. The wide expanse of tree canopy that we can contribute to in Concord provides shelter and food source to our many species of wild life and avian population that thrive here. As our community continues to develop, we encourage our local residents to explore the benefits that your individual property may have by adding trees, evergreens and bushes to your landscape. We often extol how beautiful Concord Township is and we should work together as caretakers to have it remain as the focal point of Lake County.



## Construction Season

By the time of this printing work should be well underway on long awaited road improvement projects on Christian and Jason

Avenue. These roads, which were originally constructed in 1976, have gradually fallen into a state of disrepair. Continuous patching and spot repairs had become redundant. With the dedicated help of Ted Galuschik, Lake County Engineer, we put together a replacement plan that included good drainage practices that will sustain these roads for many years to come. This nearly nine hundred thousand dollar project is partially happening due to our ability to secure part of the funding from Ohio Public Works Commission through a road improvement grant. Simultaneously additional road improvements will also be taking place within the Creekview Park subdivision, Concord Pointe and Danvers Drive. These roads will all be resurfaced. During these improvement projects, residents will be faced with the daunting unexpected delays and controlled movement within the work zone. In the case of total replacement on Christian and Jason Avenue, the residents of that particular area will be without access to their road or driveway for multiple days in order to complete the project. We at the Service Department respect each resident's tolerance, patience and wherewithal for the inconvenience that they will face over the next couple of months. In addition to road improvement, the Concord Service Department will install bio-retention islands on Christian Avenue and Concord Pointe Drive. This method of controlling storm water run-off provides a natural water treatment process which will help eliminate pollutants from storm water prior to it entering tributaries that lead to our great Lake Erie.

These two cul-de-sacs were identified as having a suitable diameter to install bio-retention islands to replace previously asphalted and concreted surfaces. This method of temporarily collecting and storing rainwater takes the burden off our local storm sewer systems during moderate to heavy rainfall. Each island will see the elimination of nearly 2,000 square feet of impervious paved surface that served no practical purpose. Each island consists of a specific soil, mulch and plant content that help filter and absorb pollutants that would previously go directly into the storm system. In this method the rain water temporarily ponds and filters over a period of days. Lake County Storm Water Agency supports this type of project and sees it as being beneficial to our regional drainage systems and again partnered with Concord Township to help fund this best management practice.

## Spring Brush & Yard Waste Drop-off

Our spring brush and yard waste drop-off will be held on Saturday May 18th and Saturday June 8th. Township crews will be on hand to assist residents at the Service Department located at 7229 Ravenna Road between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Department employees will be on hand to unload brush and yard waste as you

**Lt. Mike Biddell**

**C**hicago Fire, Rescue Me, Third Watch, Emergency . . . Each of these TV shows provide us with glimpses into what appears to be the world of firefighting. The intensity of five alarm high rise fires, hostage situations and car's hanging off the side of mountainsides make captivating TV drama. However, these intense TV scenarios create a misconception of what a true, day-to-day shift is like for most firefighters. According to Lt.

Mike Biddell, a 16-year firefighter for Concord Township Fire Department, day-to-day incidents are more than likely a response to Concord's aging population. Concord's firefighters witness the daily health and financial struggles of our elderly residents. There isn't always a quick fix, resolved in a 30-minute segment. Firefighters want to help, but are sometimes limited in what help they can provide.

It was this desire to help others, to be part of the community and the camaraderie between firefighters which led Lt. Biddell into the fire service. As a graduate of Auburn Career Center's firefighting and EMT program, Lt. Biddell was trained by several of Concord's firefighters who are Auburn instructors. These encounters led him to start his firefighting career as a part time firefighter with Concord Township. Mike finalized his paramedic training shortly after being hired and has worked his way through the ranks, promoted to a full time position in 2003 and Lieutenant in 2015. To be able to meet the demands of increased responsibility, Lt. Biddell never stopped training and seeking educational opportunities. During his tenure with Concord, Lt. Biddell has obtained his Bachelor of Science and MBA from Franklin University. He is also a Fire Instructor, Fire Safety Inspector and Con-Ed Instructor.

Lt. Biddell's responsibilities within the department include overseeing A shift at Station 2 and new hire orientation. He has been instrumental in revamping the orientation process to more efficiently make new hires feel a part of the team from day one. Lt. Biddell hopes to apply his education to promote leadership within Concord's firefighters, to support and encourage each firefighter to identify their goals and assist them in establishing plans to meet those goals. His education has helped him better understand the need for effective communication between department members, administration and most importantly, with the community served.

Lt. Biddell plays a large part in Concord Fire's public education programs. He utilizes his trainings as part of Concord's team of CPR instructors. Community CPR is provided to church groups, day care and schools and fitness instructors. Lt. Biddell is also a certified safety seat technician, one of five of Concord's firefighters who are trained to help install child car seats.

To Lt. Biddell, being able to help a resident and their family on what is often the worst day of their lives is the best part of his job. On the flip side of the coin, seeing the "worst day in someone's life" over and over again, can take a huge mental and emotional toll on a firefighter. That is where the camaraderie between firefighters comes into play – supporting each other through those incidents.

One thing that is often accurately portrayed on those TV dramas and what Lt. Biddell feels is a rewarding aspect of being a firefighter: When a patient drops into the fire station to thank the firefighters who helped them through the worst day of their life, giving them the chance to spend another day with their family and loved ones.

## Cemetery Decorations

Please understand that if you are placing sentimental items

on the graves, they may get lost, stolen or damaged; if it's something that's near and dear to your heart, we do not recommend that it be placed in the cemetery.

April 15th – October 31st one (1) live decoration and one (1) non-floral, stand-alone decoration (statues, pinwheels, trinkets, etc.) placed on the footer extension is permitted per gravesite as long as it does not impede the maintenance of grounds. The cemetery staff reserves the right to remove any live decorations and non-floral decorations not in keeping with the beautification of the cemetery. Glass of any kind (including gazing balls), Styrofoam, bird houses and feeders are prohibited.

arrive at the collection center. Brush will be chipped and made available to the residents on a first come first serve basis. Yard waste will be taken to a local recycle center for repurposing. Only limbs, twigs, and branches or tree stalks no greater than six inches in diameter will be accepted. No tree stumps, pallets, contaminated materials or processed wood such as lumber or railroad ties are accepted. Yard waste should be placed in biodegradable paper bags or small containers that can easily be dumped by personnel.

### How much time does it take to receive approval?

A zoning permit for a fence is generally approved within a couple of days.

### How much does it cost to get a fence permit?

The fee for a fence permit for a residential property is \$50.

### What happens if I don't get a permit?

If a permit is required and you do not file for a permit, you may be subject to additional fines or fees until the appropriate paperwork is filed.




