Minutes of Concord Township Board of Trustees Meeting

Held on May 6, 2020

This meeting was held via Webex Teleconference and YouTube Live Streaming.

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met for a Regular meeting on May 6, 2020, 7:30 pm, in Town Hall, located at 7229 Ravenna Road. Chairman Carl H. Dondorfer called the meeting to order and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Trustees present were Carl H. Dondorfer, Amy L. Lucci and Morgan R. McIntosh.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

April 15, 2020 Regular Trustees Meeting. Mrs. Lucci moved to approve the April 15, 2020 Regular Meeting Minutes as written. Mr. McIntosh seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORT:

A. FISCAL OFFICER – Amy L. Dawson

As of April 30, we were 33% of the way through the calendar year. The Treasury Balance for the 18 active Funds within the Township Treasury was \$6.7 million. The Treasury Balance includes \$2.3 million in funds set aside for specific projects. Year-to-date expenditures were 24% of the amount appropriated and revenue is at 46% received for 2020, so we are within budget.

I received the Tax Budget information from the Auditor this week and will be preparing the information. Every year we have to do a Public Hearing that is on the inside millage and outside millage. I recommend a Public Hearing before the Regular Trustees Meeting on May 20, 2020 at 7:20 pm. The Trustees all agreed to set the Tax Budget Public Hearing for May 20, 2020 at 7:20 pm.

B. TRUSTEES:

Mrs. Lucci – I would like to offer support as we go through this crisis; appreciate everyone being flexible and proactive with the ongoing changes; “thank you” to our Departments for continuing to provide great service; take this time to educate yourself and stay grounded and positive; I talked with a concerned resident about EMS Services and if their request to be transported to a certain hospital would be met; I explained it is based on many different factors; wished all the mom’s a Happy Mother’s Day (see transcripts for more details).

Mr. McIntosh – It has been a busy couple of weeks with complaints and dialogue regarding zoning issues; heard from a business owner in Concord looking to build a facility in the Township; complaint about the lighting of Parkside Elementary School; Service Dept. was out today and planted trees along the walking path to the school; Fire Dept. Project clarification with “The News Herald” article recently published; my quote was to give perspective on specific data and use as a point of reference on how we plan to utilize the new facility; no decision has been made and this does not mean we are moving forward with the project; we pledged to meet with the community and engage in conversations and we are committed to that; echo Mrs. Lucci’s comments regarding COVID-19 (see transcripts for more details).

Mr. Dondorfer – I will echo the other Trustees sentiments regarding COVID-19; we hope the community is well and safe during this time; we are here so feel free to reach out to us; spoke with a resident concerned with the condition of Hermitage Road and speeding; working with law enforcement on this issue; received a couple of zoning complaints that Heather is working on; we are aware and on-top of a safety concern with a rental being used as a gathering place during COVID-19 crisis, and we are working with the HOA, law enforcement, health department and legal counsel and taking initiative in the near future to prevent this from happening again (see transcripts for more details).

DEPARTMENT REPORT:

A. ADMINISTRATION DEPT. – Andy Rose, Administrator

- Good Evening. I would like to start by bringing an item needing a vote up from the floor. On May 12, the Ohio Attorney General’s Office is conducting a Public Records Training webinar. I will be attending this session on behalf of the Trustees. This is required training pursuant to ORC section 109.43(B) and 149.43 (E)(1). I would ask for a vote from the floor.

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Mr. McIntosh moved to have Andy Rose, Administrator for Concord Township, attend the Ohio Attorney General's Public Records Training webinar on behalf of Trustees Carl H. Dondorfer, Amy L. Lucci and Morgan R. McIntosh. Mrs. Lucci seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

- Good news. In a recent report, Concord Township is in 39th place out of 2,245 local governments in Census responses. We have a 78.6% participation rate. I strongly encourage ALL residents who have not yet completed the Census to get that done soon. Completing the census helps our community. For those that have already completed the survey, thank you.
- With regard to the COVID-19 virus, here are a few updates:
 - ❖ Township administrative offices at Town Hall are open to the public for regular business. We have installed plexiglass barriers at our counters and employees are wearing masks when away from their assigned work spaces. All desks are at least 6 feet apart. Public visitors are encouraged to wear a mask when visiting Town Hall, and we also encourage business continue to be conducted via phone, fax, email, or regular mail. We continue to utilize the drop box at the front door for anyone wishing to drop off paperwork.
 - ❖ Any questions or concerns regarding the COVID-19 virus should be directed to the Lake County General Health District. There is a link on our website that will take you directly to the Health District's COVID-19 page for more information.
- A few other items of note:
 - ❖ I continue to stay in regular contact with Lake County Mayors and Managers, and we are all continuing to coordinate during our regularly scheduled conference calls.
 - ❖ Please remember there are local restaurants that remain open for carryout service. We encourage all of our residents to "shop local" when considering takeout food.

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C. SERVICE DEPT. – Tim Brown, Service Director

- Good evening everyone, the construction season is in full swing in Concord. The Lancaster Rd. project is moving along as planned. The entire road has been removed and concrete stabilized. After the stabilization was completed the proof roll was performed on the west side and was excellent according to Lake County Engineers. As of today the east side of the road was stabilized and will need to cure for 5 days and then another proof roll will be performed. The crews from Tri Mor continue to move forward with the installation of curb drains and curb inlet repairs. If all goes well Tri Mor is planning on pouring the concrete end of next week.
- The Cali Woods, Alexander, and Bridlewood resurfacing is under way as of Friday 5/1. Crews from Karvo Paving and Specialized Construction have begun working in both areas. Other areas under construction are Concord-Hambden Rd, Morley Rd, and Pinecrest. These are roads being resurfaced by the County.
- On April 24th the Service Department celebrated Arbor Day with the planting of two trees at the Old Stone School. The trees were donated by The Holden Arboretum and Klyn Nursery.
- The Service Department crews continue to work on ditch maintenance throughout the township. Also we have begun our curb inlet repairs. Downed and dead tree removal was performed on Tulip Way and Martinique Dr.
- The yard waste dumpster, located at the Service Department, has been very busy with a steady flow of residents taking advantage of this service provided by Concord Twp. We would like to remind residents the dump site is open Monday thru Friday from 7:30am - 2:30pm .
- In closing the Service Department would like to wish everyone a Happy Mother's Day and a safe and healthy spring. If residents have any questions or concerns they are reminded to contact the Service Department at 440-350-3225 or email at www.concordtwp.com .

D. ZONING DEPT. – Heather Freeman, Zoning Director

- During the month of April, the Zoning Department processed 25 zoning permit applications and collected \$3,100 in fees.
- Last night the Zoning Commission held their regular meeting, which included a public hearing for an application to rezone approximately 29 acres of land on Colburn Road from R-1 to R-2, RCD. The ZC voted to recommend approval with modifications of the district change and preliminary plan. The Commission will be forwarding their recommendation to the Trustees later this month in order for the Trustees to set a public hearing on the application.
- Next week the BZA will meet Wednesday night at 7pm. There are four new variance cases. The detailed agenda and how to participate in the meeting may be found by going to the Concord Township website, click on public meetings, and choose BZA.
- Finally, the Zoning office is again open to residents and contractors that need permits. We are still encouraging people to utilize the drop box at Town Hall to submit paperwork. Please continue to call us or email us with your questions, so we may assist you.

E. REC. DEPT – Debra Bechel-Esker, Recreation Director

- Good Evening everyone. Well, things are certainly different for a Recreation Department these days. COVID-19 has altered our course for the spring and summer, and even though the Community Center and Old Stone School remain closed to the public, and classes/events/programs and rentals are either rescheduled, cancelled or postponed, your Concord Township Recreation Department is still hard at work for our residents.
- Starting this month, children are encouraged to enter our virtual Kid's Coloring Contest. Here's how it works: Kids draw & color pictures with a "Send-A-Hug" theme or our "ConcordTough" theme – or both! Parents take a picture of the masterpiece and email it to Recreation@concordtwp.com. We will forward the artwork to local seniors, or safety & healthcare front line heroes to brighten their day. This contest runs thru July 31st and kids can enter as many times as they wish. Names of all the artists will be included in a raffle drawing for gift cards to local businesses. Details are on our website, or contact the Recreation Department with any questions.
- If you're looking for a way to help those in need, consider donating to Concord Township's Canned Food Drive. Drop off your donation at the receptacle located outside the back entrance of Town Hall. Donations will be delivered to the St. Gabriel Food Pantry and other local pantries in need. Items most in-demand include peanut butter and jelly, canned tuna and canned soup. The drive is going on now thru May 31.

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- Our Senior outreach initiatives are blossoming. We will begin to send “Virtual Hugs” to Concord senior citizens in May. We expect to receive lots of hug pictures from Concord kids as a result of our coloring contest, and we’ll forward those hugs to local seniors for an unexpected splash of happiness! We are expanding the Seniors page of the Concord Township website to include more links to local senior services. One important link is the Lake County General Health District’s “We Thrive Together” initiative, that lists ways seniors all over Lake County can engage in social interaction. Right now, they are concentrating on how seniors can stay socially active from their homes, and are providing programs like phone-in bingo and trivia games, attending virtual cooking or exercise classes thru Zoom, and participating in chat groups about an attitude of gratitude, and much more. We are also loading up our senior web page with fun and informative at-home activities, like easy stretching exercises to get your body moving, local birds to watch and feed, healthy recipes to try, writing a daily gratitude list, crosswords, word searches and that hot new trend of coloring pages for grown-ups. All of these initiatives will be included in our new & improved senior newsletter that will be mailed in June.
- There is another group of seniors we would like to acknowledge and honor. Our High School Seniors. Teenagers who are graduating high school this spring have had their lives marked by two unprecedented milestones. They were born just after the 9/11 tragedy, and now are finishing their high school experience in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. It’s unclear if any of them will be able to wear the traditional cap & gown and walk across the stage to cheers and applause from family and friends. So we’re going to honor our Seniors by asking them to share a beloved graduation tradition with us. Announcing Operation Grad Cap. Take a picture of your decorated graduation cap and send it to Recreation@concordtwp.com along with your name and high school by June 30th. We’ll create a collage and post it to our website and social media platforms for you to share, and all of Concord to see! Details are on our website, or contact the Recreation Department with any questions.
- Although we may not be able to gather together for big celebrations right now, we can still move forward with two of our most beloved Community Day traditions. Nominations are now being accepted for Concord Township’s Citizen of the Year! Do you know someone who has made a positive difference in our township? Download the nomination form from our website and send it in by July 6. Applications are currently being accepted for our traditional Community Day Scholarships. This year, we are able to offer three scholarships, in the amount of \$1,000 each, to graduating high school seniors who reside in Concord Township. These scholarships are made possible through the generosity of Lake Health and University Hospitals. Download the application form from our website and send it in by July 6th.
- We continue to make progress on an Images of America book, honoring Concord Township’s Bicentennial. If you have a family photo or artifact depicting life in Concord over the past 200 years, please consider sharing it with us for possible inclusion in the book. One of our book chapters is called “Notable Concord Residents” and we are seeking your recommendations for people to include in this chapter. We’d love to hear from you!
- Statistics show that during this unprecedented time, Ohioans are visiting parks a lot more frequently for walking and hiking. Did you know you can access the MetroParks Greenway Corridor, thru the parking lot of our own Old Stone School? Well you CAN! Recently we published a post on Facebook, giving a nod to Monty Python’s “Silly Walking skit”. It-went-viral. If you’re a Monty Python fan, you now have an image in your head of John Cleese and his remarkable flexibility. We challenge you to do your best “Silly Walk” and send pictures to Recreation@concordtwp.com. We’ll compile the silliness, and you may find yourself on the Recreation section of our website! The Old Stone School is located at 7125 Ravenna Road. The pathway with the “Silly Walk” signs is behind the schoolhouse, adjacent to the Community Garden.
- There are many ways to stay informed on township happenings. Start by reading the Summer Grapevine newsletter and subscribing to our monthly e-mail newsletter, the e-Grapevine. You can also download the Concord APP and visit our highly informative website. Follow us on social media platforms including Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Or, simply pick up the phone and call for immediate assistance. But be sure to check out the new “Talk of the Township” video (our new Board of Trustees’ first quarterly update to residents) available for on-demand viewing on our website now.
- So although we can’t gather together right now, we can still encourage our kids to enter a coloring contest. We can still help those in need by donating to a food drive. We can still check in on our senior neighbors and nominate people for Citizen of the Year. We can encourage our graduates to participate in Operation Grad Cap and apply for traditional Scholarships. We can still honor our past by sending in pictures of Concord history. And we can take a break from our worries by doing a little silly walking. 

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
