Minutes of Concord Township Board of Trustees Meeting

Held on July 1, 2020

This meeting was held via Webex Teleconference and YouTube Live Streaming. See transcripts for more details.

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met for a Regular meeting on July 1, 2020, at 7:31 pm, in Town Hall, located at 7229 Ravenna Road. Chairman Carl H. Dondorfer participated remotely via Webex. Vice-Chairman Morgan R. McIntosh chaired the meeting. Morgan R. McIntosh called the meeting to order and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Trustees present were Amy L. Lucci, Carl H. Dondorfer and Morgan R. McIntosh.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

June 17, 2020 Public Hearing. Mrs. Lucci moved to approve the June 17, 2020 Public Hearing Minutes as written. Mr. McIntosh seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

June 17, 2020 Regular Trustees Meeting. Mrs. Lucci moved to approve the June 17, 2020 Regular Meeting Minutes as written. Mr. Dondorfer seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

June 26, 2020 Special Meeting. Mrs. Lucci moved to approve the June 26, 2020 Special Meeting Minutes as written. Mr. Dondorfer seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORT:

A. FISCAL OFFICER – Report read by Andy Rose, Administrator

As of June 30, we were 50% of the way through the calendar year. The Treasury Balance for the 19 funds within the Township Treasury was \$6.0 million. The Treasury Balance includes \$1.9 million in funds set aside for specific projects. Year-to-date expenditures as of June 30, 2020 were 37% of the amount appropriated for 2020. The revenue received year to date is at 56%, so we are well within budget. I would like to remind our residents that every check we write is listed in the meeting minutes found on our website at www.concordtwp.com. We have been listing bills paid this way in our minutes for our residents since the early 1900's. A few years ago we joined www.ohiocheckbook.com that is soon to change over to www.ohiocheckbook.gov and details of all checks written since 2013 are available. The link is located under the Fiscal Officer page on our website, or you may access it directly. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to call our office at 354-7516.

B. TRUSTEES:

Mrs. Lucci – I had continued discussions with residents on the Fire Station Project. I heard new insights, some concerns as well as support for the project. The Board understands the importance of your feedback and encourages it. I met with some residents regarding some County Road issues. Wished everyone a Happy Fourth of July.

Mr. Dondorfer – I had some stormwater issues that are being worked on. Looking forward to the next Fire Station Project Stakeholder Meeting, and I hope to continue the good feedback and dialogue. Wished everyone a Happy Fourth of July.

Mr. McIntosh – I had a number of constructive conversations with residents regarding the Fire Station Project. There has been good dialogue. Received some complaints regarding a gun club and the associated noise. I spoke with some residents about concerns with speeding on Hermitage Road. We are looking into having extra patrols in that area. Here is a recap of the JEDD meeting a couple of weeks ago: The Board is moving forward with NextSite, a vendor that helps us market the land and provide development tracking. This will help drive economic development in the business corridor; several months ago Mr. Ray Sines was appointed by the Township to the JEDD Board. Wished everyone a Happy Fourth of July.

DEPARTMENT REPORT:

A. ADMINISTRATION DEPT. – Andy Rose, Administrator

Good evening. It is good to have Department Heads back for the meeting. A few things to cover this evening:

- Information regarding Fire Station Stakeholder Meeting #2 is scheduled for July 14th and should be posted to the website sometime next week.

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- The permits for the "No Littering" signs should be back next week. Service Department will install those once received from the sign maker.
- On the agenda is the CARES Act funding Resolution 2020-19 which allows us to receive CARES Act funding. Once the County Auditor receives the resolution, funds will be disbursed pursuant to the local government distribution formula. These funds may only be utilized to offset direct COVID-19 expenditures.
- I spoke with Hull Engineering regarding the Kellogg Creek Restoration Project (formerly known as the Brightwood Lake Dam removal project). We should be receiving a detailed update by July 10, and we will post that project update to our website.
- I will be out of the office on Thursday and Monday. We are closed on Friday in observance of Independence Day. I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable holiday when we celebrate our Nation's independence.

C. SERVICE DEPT. – Tim Brown, Service Director

Good evening, the Service Department was busy in the month of June:

- The Landcaster concrete road replacement project was completed by Tri Mor.paving on Alexander. Karvo Paving completed the paving work on Alexander and Bridlewood. The Cali woods paving project is about 90% complete and should be finishing up in the next two weeks.
- The salt dome project was completed, with the concrete pad and block foundation installed by our personnel. The contractor showed up a week later to install the steel framed arch and fabric roof to the foundation. Having the extra storage for salt has expanded the Service Department's ability to keep other materials that require dry storage on site.
- Crews have also been working on several driveway culvert replacements and ditch maintenance within the Township.
- To prevent premature deterioration of existing roadways, crews have been out crack sealing, and the concrete crew has begun concrete road repairs throughout the Township.

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- The Service Department continues to work with residents and the Lake County Storm Water Management Department on flooding issues within the Township.
- Residents continue to utilize the Yard Waste dumpster located at the Service Department. This has been a huge success and we get a lot of positive feedback.
- The Service Department would like to wish everyone a safe and healthy summertime and remind residents to contact us at 440-350-3225 or at www.concordtwp.com with any questions or concerns.

D. ZONING DEPT. – Report read by Andy Rose, Administrator

- During the month of June, the Zoning Department processed 52 zoning permit applications and collected \$5,750 in fees.
- Additionally, we performed 98 inspections for open zoning permits and investigated 7 new complaints for potential zoning violations.
- Information on next week's Zoning Commission and BZA meetings, including their agendas, may be found on the Township website at concordtwp.com/government/public-meetings/
- Finally, I'd like to thank our Concord Township residents for responding to the 2020 Census. As of June 29th, 82.7% of Concord Township households have responded to the Census. This far exceeds both the State and County rates which are 66.4% and 75.2% respectfully. Additionally, Concord Township has the highest response rate in Lake County, and ranks 37th overall in the State. There is still time to respond, so if you haven't please take the time to do so. Thank you!

E. RECREATION DEPT. – Debra Esker, Recreation Director

Good Evening Everybody.

- I am happy to report that Concord Township Recreation facilities are now open and used everyday.
- Playgrounds at Town Hall, Coleridge Park and Concord Hills Park are open and active. The ball fields at Town Hall are busy every evening and weekend, as are the basketball and tennis courts at Concord Hills Park. The plots at the Community Garden behind the Old Stone School are planted and being tenderly cared for, and the Community Center is once again *the place to be* for smaller leisure classes, community groups and rentals. We truly appreciate resident and guest continued cooperation adhering to social distancing and limited capacity guidelines.
- The Concord Community Center reopened in June. Classes that were suspended when we closed in mid-March have resumed, and small community groups are beginning to meet again. Rentals are now moving forward with capacity and distancing limitations. Tuesdays from 1-4 pm and Wednesdays from 10am to 3pm are designated senior hours at the Community Center, reserved for residents age 55+, for small group activities. In accordance with State and County mandates, all guests entering the Community Center must sign a log book for contact tracing purposes. Beginning this month, residents can enjoy exercise and craft classes at the Community Center, including Martial Arts, Yoga Pilates Fusion, POUND, Tai Chi, creating a Mosaic Flower Pot and Tennis classes for kids. I am thrilled to announce our new line-up of VIRTUAL music classes, including Movement and Music for younger children, Creative Music Making and Songwriting for teens, Piano Lessons for adults and (my favorite) Ukelele Basics for teens and adults.
- We are employing *Universal Precautions* at the Community Center. Specifically, capacity limitations, social distancing measures, sanitation protocols and masks. Rental room capacity will be limited to 35 people per room as opposed to 70 under normal circumstances. Tables must be placed at least 6 feet apart and individuals or family huddles should maintain social distance. High touch surfaces will be cleaned every two hours with a thorough cleaning every day. Recreation staff will wear masks and we encourage guests to do the same. We are happy to welcome people back to the Community Center in a safe and appropriate way.
- Celebrate your ability to give the gift of life by donating blood. There is a shortage right now, so every donation is precious. The Recreation Department will host a Red Cross Blood Drive at the Community Center on Tuesday, July 14th from 10am to 3pm. Our goal is to schedule at least 25 donor appointments for that day. So if you want to be one of those life-saving heroes, sign up at www.redcrossblood.org and type in sponsor code "ConcordCC", or simply call us and we can schedule your appointment. The bonus is they now test for COVID antibodies with every completed blood donation.
- Concord Township celebrates and congratulates our Graduates! Even though high school and college graduates might not have had the opportunity to toss their caps in the air with classmates to get that once-in-a-lifetime photo, we encourage them to continue the beloved tradition of decorating their graduation cap, and sharing that picture with us. Send your picture to Recreation@concordtwp.com and we will share it with the Township on our website! 2020 High School graduates living in Concord Township are encouraged to apply for one of 3 annual Concord Township Scholarship Awards, each in the amount of \$1,000. Applications are available on our website now and are due SOON - by July 6th. A BIG thank you to Lake Health and University Hospitals for once again sponsoring our annual scholarship awards.

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- We always love to celebrate our residents, and this month there are two special ways to honor those that have gone "above and beyond" to make our township the captivating and charming community that it is. We are currently accepting nominations for the next Concord Township Citizen of the Year! Each year, we recognize someone who exemplifies dedication to our community and the betterment of our township. If you know someone worthy of this honor, I encourage you to nominate them today! Residents can download forms from our website. The deadline for submission is SOON - July 6th. Over the past two years, we have asked residents for input in a book that is being written about Concord Township history in honor of our upcoming Bicentennial. Once again, we ask for their help. One chapter is dedicated to 'Notable Concord Residents', and we are seeking your recommendations of people to include in this prestigious chapter. Please contact the Recreation Department with thoughts and suggestions.
- Now it's time to celebrate Concord Kids! I'd like to send a big Shout-Out to all of our little artists who have sent us virtual masterpieces for our Coloring Contest! The Hugs they've sent have certainly brightened our day and have been passed along to local senior citizens to spread the happiness and joy all around the township! - Concord Township will celebrate its Bicentennial in 2022. In preparation of this momentous occasion, we are collecting Concord history to be used in displays, publications and potentially included in a book. - I'm sending another shout-out to all the wonderful silly people who have risen to the challenge of our **Silly Walk** at the Old Stone School! Thanks for sending in pictures and sharing these treasured happy moments with our community! The Silly Walk is located behind the Old Stone School, at 7125 Ravenna Road. It is on the path next to the Community Garden that connects the parking lot to the Greenway Corridor near Chair Factory Falls. So next time you are out for a walk or hike, head over to the Old Stone School, check out the beautiful flowers around the schoolhouse, the early plantings in the community garden, and show off your silliness! Send us a picture of your best silly walk and find yourself on the recreation page of the township website!
- There is **so** much to celebrate right now. We live in a beautiful and vibrant township, where residents care deeply about our community and our future. We are working **together** to plan Concord's future, and make our township stronger and safer and even more cherished. We celebrate the careful reopening of recreational facilities, and congratulate our graduates. We celebrate our history as we head into our Bicentennial year, and honor the people who have worked diligently to create our beloved community. And for months now, residents have handled the COVID crisis with grace and resilience. It's time to celebrate – and even though all of us are not physically together, please know that the Recreation Department is celebrating with you.

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RESOLUTION 2020-18

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR CONCORD TOWNSHIP TO ENTER INTO A RENTAL SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR GARMENT RENTAL WITH CINTAS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Concord Township Board of Trustees, Lake County, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to enter into a Rental Service Agreement with CINTAS for garment rental and related services, in a form substantially similar to the CINTAS Standard Rental Service Agreement annexed hereto and incorporated herein and to further authorize the Township Administrator, Andy Rose, to execute any and all documents necessary to properly complete the agreement in accordance herewith.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in those formal actions were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- C. RESOLUTION 2020-19, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR CONCORD TOWNSHIP OR ITS DESIGNEE, THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATOR, TO APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT). Mrs. Lucci moved to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-19

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR CONCORD TOWNSHIP OR ITS DESIGNEE, THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATOR, TO APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT).

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 116 Public Law, (the CARES Act) was signed into law by the President of the United States on March 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly established a process for distributing funds provided by the "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act" in Senate Bill 310 of the 133rd General Assembly (S.B. 310); and

WHEREAS, S.B. 310 requires subdivisions receiving funds under Section 1 of the Act, to pass an ordinance or resolution affirming that funds from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund may be expended only to cover costs of the subdivision consistent with the requirements of Section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601 (d), and any applicable regulations before receiving said funds; and

WHEREAS, Concord Township is requesting its share of funds from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. The Board of Trustees of Concord Township hereby affirms that all funds received from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund pursuant to S.B. 310 be expended only to cover costs of the subdivision consistent with the requirements of Section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), and any applicable regulations and guidance only to cover expenses that:

- a. Are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);
- b. Were not accounted for in Concord Township's most recently approved budget as of March 30, 2020; and
- c. Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

SECTION 2. In compliance with S.B. 310, the Board of Trustees for Concord Township, or its designee, the Concord Township Administrator are further authorized to take all necessary action to further the purposes of this Resolution, specifically including that:

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- a. On or before October 15, 2020, pay any unencumbered balance of money in the Concord Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the County Treasurer;
- b. On or before December 28, 2020, pay the balance of any money in Concord Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the state treasury in the manner prescribed by the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management; and
- c. Provide any information related to any payments received under S.B. 310 to the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management as requested.

SECTION 3. That the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, or its designee, the Concord Township Administrator, is hereby authorized and directed to request its share of funds from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Board of Trustees of Concord Township and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in those formal actions were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Mr. Dondorfer seconded. Vote 3 ayes.

- F. FIRE DEPT. APPROVE THE REASSIGNMENT OF FIREFIGHTER I AUSTIN GEORSKEY TO THE STATUS OF REGULAR FIREFIGHTER/MEDIC EFFECTIVE JUNE 29, 2020. Mrs. Lucci moved to approve the Fire Dept. reassignment of Firefighter I Austin Georskey to the status of regular Firefighter / Medic effective June 29, 2020. Mr. Dondorfer seconded. Vote 3 ayes.
