### KEEP FIRES BURNING SAFELY

Do the chilly temperatures have you dreaming of cozy gatherings around a brightly lit fire? Whether your ideal winter retreat is in the warm glow of the family room fireplace or sitting by a fire under the stars, safety should be your first priority. Follow these helpful tips to keep you and your family safe when you use fireplaces and wood stoves:

- Have your fireplace and wood stoves inspected before you begin using them each year.
- Have the chimney cleaned to remove creosote, which can ignite and start a chimney fire.
- Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from fireplaces and wood stoves, this includes children and pets!
- When you're finished with your fire, put it out before you leave home or fall asleep.
- When you clean up, place the ashes inside a metal can with a lid. Store the can outside, away from the home, until the ashes are completely cold.

The 1st Friday of February has become nationally known as Wear Red Day to raise awareness of heart disease as the #1 health problem that affects American women. There are a few simple things we can all do to keep our awareness of heart disease in the forefront every day of the year.

## LEARN THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

By knowing the signs and symptoms of heart disease and stroke, you may be instrumental in saving a life.

### HEART ATTACK SYMPTOMS

- Chest discomfort
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, back, neck, jaw or stomach
- Lightheadedness, nausea or vomiting
- Shortness of Breath
- Breaking out in cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

### STROKE SYMPTOMS

Spot a stroke **F.A.S.T.**

- **F**acial droop or numbness on 1 side of the face. *Can the person smile?*
- **A**rm weakness or numbness. *Can the person raise both arms and keep them both up?*
- **S**peech difficulty, as in slurring. *Can the person repeat a simple phrase?*
- **T**ime to call 911

Our fall season was somewhat mild with some above average temperatures in mid-November making the cleaning up of leaves a bit easier this year. The Yard Waste dumpster provided at the Service Department was a huge success and used by many residents.

As we put 2020 behind us and prepare for a new year, The Service department is busy with winter operations. We remind residents when traveling in adverse weather to slow down and allow more time for travel. Our Crews are out maintaining the roadways when the weather hits. Please remember to give the plow trucks room to do their jobs safely and efficiently. The Concord Service Department only maintains side streets within our community. We currently have the township divided into seven sectors as a response method to snow and ice conditions. Crews are scheduled to respond best to rush hour traffic, both am and pm rush. The State of Ohio and the Lake County Engineers maintain all of the main roads that run through Concord Township. The Service Department bases its response to weather conditions with advance weather monitoring and data available through multiple resources. During an off-hours snow event, the Service Department relies on the Lake County Sheriff's Department to advise the department of changing conditions on the roads. The Service Department then calls out a crew to respond to the event. During the snow and ice control operations, our crews use sensible salting practices to help cut down on the impact of infrastructure and environment.

In order for our Crews to plow the roads adequately, we ask residents and their contracted services not to plow or blow snow into the roadway. The snow is best disbursed to either side of the driveway or apron. Ohio revised code 4511.74 clearly states no person shall place any obstruction in or upon any road without proper authority.

As we prepare for the upcoming spring and 2021 construction season our crews are out evaluating the roads for repairs and resurfacing. All the roads within the Township are evaluated and prioritized for repairs. The Service Department evaluates the Township roads every year and reprioritizes roads if necessary. In January and February, the Service Department works closely with the Lake County Engineers Office to prepare bid packages for upcoming road projects. We also plan a wide range of maintenance and construction projects during this time.

The Service Department continues to work with the Lake County stormwater Department on drainage issues throughout the township. Planning work to improve drainage is ongoing and performed as the weather cooperates.

## SNOW BARRICADES

The Mailbox Snow Barricade program is available through the Service Department to residents of Concord Township. The service Department provides the labor to install the barricades next to your mailbox to help absorb the impact of snow from plows to the mailbox. Residents whom wish to have a barricade installed can do so by filling out the snow barricade application found on the Concord Township website or at Town Hall. Residents must purchase the barricade and hardware at a cost of \$40.00 from Concord Township. Once payment is received, the installation is scheduled. This will be a one-time installation and all further maintenance thereafter is the responsibility of the resident. Please keep in mind that the barricade is not a guarantee that your mailbox will not be damaged during the course of the winter season.

With hopes of spring and warm weather on its way, residents may soon be thinking about installing a pool for their recreational enjoyment in the upcoming summer months. The following article summarizes the zoning and permit requirements for installing a pool on a residential lot in Concord Township.

Swimming pools must be located at least 15 feet from any side property line, 10 feet from the rear property line, and 50 feet from the road right-of-way. In-ground pools are required to have a minimum 4 ft. high wall or fence with a controlled access point to the pool. Above-ground pools shall be enclosed by either a fence or pool wall not less than 4 feet in height, with a controlled access point such as a removable ladder. These fence/wall requirements are in place to ensure that the pool area is kept safe from small children accidentally falling in to the pool when supervision is not available. A pool cover is not a suitable substitute for the fencing requirement.

If your above-ground pool has a small entry deck or no decking, you can add safety fencing that attaches to your pool's supports and provides a barrier along the top edge of your pool. Safety fencing is made of weatherproof vinyl or composite materials and comes in 5- to 6-foot-long sections that are 18-to 24-inches high. Edge safety fencing is made so you can easily see through it. These kits are relatively inexpensive and may be purchased at your local home improvement store.

Another option is to enclose the entire pool area with childproof fencing. The fencing should be 4- to 5-feet high and have no horizontal supports that allow climbing. Openings between fence pickets should be no more than 4 inches apart and yet have enough space so that a parent or supervisor can easily see what's on the other side.

A zoning permit is required for both above-ground and in-ground pools. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that the proper permits are obtained prior to construction, either by the contractor/company hired to do the project or by the residents



themselves. A site plan or drawing of the property must accompany the application that shows the size and location of the pool and fence (if applicable), as well as the proposed distances to property lines.

The current Zoning Permit charge for an above-ground pool is \$100, and \$150 for an in-ground pool (with fence). ## SPRING CLEAN OUT

### Decoration Removals:

- Gravesites are to be cleaned of decorations starting April 1st
- Please allow two (2) weeks to be sure removal has been completed before placing new decorations on your gravesite, this will protect your new decorations from being accidentally removed; items in an urn or on a monument will not be removed unless items pertain to a past holiday or they are

unkempt; please contact the cemetery office if honoring a loved one seven (7) days prior the removal times listed above

- Placing live and artificial decorations for honoring "loved ones" special dates (birthdays/anniversaries/Mother's-Father's Day/major holidays such as Christmas, Independence Day, Halloween, Memorial Day, etc.) should be removed fourteen (14) days after the date or it will be removed by cemetery staff

### Decorating Rules – April 15th – October 31st

- One (1) live decoration per occupied gravesite (pot/basket/urn) April 15th Oct 31st
- Any decoration must be placed at the side or front of the headstone, at the head of the grave if no headstone exists and may extend to a maximum of 12" from the monument on the owner's lot(s)
- One (1) steel rod hanger (shepherd's hook) is permitted per monument; hangers shall be placed flush at the side of the monument; all hangers should have a visible decoration on the hook at all times for the safety of those walking by the hanger

### Planting in the Cemetery

- No planting will be allowed in the 2004 in-ground cremation section; no trees shall be planted in the 2004 section
- All trees and shrubbery, type and location, must be approved by the Cemetery Sexton; in-ground plantings will not be allowed until the monument is placed and it shall not encroach on the neighboring grave
- Concord Township reserves the right to maintain plantings, which may include trimming or removal if deemed necessary by the Cemetery Sexton or Cemetery Superintendent and will not be replaced


