A Letter from the Board of Trustees

It has been a soggy summer, but still a quick one. We have enjoyed a fun concert series with great bands, wonderful food and fellowship. We thank all of the sponsors that helped make these events possible. It doesn't seem possible that we are shuffling kids back to school (but grateful that they will be going back in person!) Before our very eyes, the leaves will be changing and our beautiful community will show all of its fall colors.

This Fall will also be a busy time for our elected officials. Morgan McIntosh was selected for and completed The Ohio State University's John Glenn College of Public Affairs Public Leadership Academy for Elected Officials. "I was honored and privileged to be a part of the select group of participants at this leadership academy. It was truly the most unique and empowering leadership training I have received. I will use the skills I learned from this transformative experience in my role as trustee to benefit our community," said McIntosh.

Additionally, our Fire Chief, Matt Sabo, along with our project team is advancing the fire station project. We will plan a groundbreaking as the project progresses. (Read more on this project on page 2.)

Some additional projects are approaching completion as we enter fall. The Lake County Engineers conducted the Crile Road widening project to expand and incorporate a turning lane. While road construction is always a source of frustration, the project went well and the road will now be much easier to navigate with a turn lane. The businesses commented that this will improve the traffic conditions. Additional road projects in the township include the SR 608 Resurfacing between the Geauga County line and Painesville-Ravenna Rd. The resurfacing is projected to be completed in October. Please drive carefully through the construction areas. Our service department also completed projects on Cherry Hill and Faye Road as well as performing stormwater and ditch maintenance and culvert replacements. The service department would like to extend their gratitude to the residents for their patience as they work on these necessary repairs.

One proposal that will not move forward this year is the single hauler trash contract. After much discussion with residents, the township has decided not to pursue this at this time. While the proposal would increase services and decrease trash truck traffic, many residents were opposed. Our trustees listened to the residents and the decision has been made to not proceed with the proposal.

We are excited about the Lucky's Market opening, the new pickle ball courts and some other new businesses coming into the area as well! Stay tuned to our Facebook page for more information!

We hope that you will take some time as summer turns into fall to enjoy the parks and the beautiful fall foliage on the trails and in the parks that our community has to offer.

PLANS FOR NEW FIRE STATIONS BLAZE FORWARD

 \mathbf{F} rom its humble beginnings of the Concord Township Fire Department in 1948, we are excited to see plans blaze forward to replace the two existing fire stations for the community. The Township Trustees have selected RFC Contracting as the Owner's Representative who has been working side-by-side with the Township and Fire Department to prepare the bid documents and will continue to guide us through the construction process.

As of the writing of this article, all plan review authorities have reviewed the construction documents and both projects have gone out to bid on August 11, 2021. Submitted bids will be opened and read publicly on Thursday, September 2, 2021.

The Township Trustees have had much discussion into which station will be built first, focusing on continued emergency coverage and services. Station #1 will be built first to completion, and then work will begin at Station #2. Station #1 will be built directly across from the existing Station #1 on Concord-Hambden Rd. in the existing soccer field. Station #2 will be built on the existing property that Station #2 and Fire Prevention Bureau are currently located.

Fire Chief Matt Sabo emphasizes that while Station #2 is under construction, emergency services will continue to be located in the same area. This allows the Fire Department to continue to provide rapid emergency services for residents and businesses served by this station.

The Concord Township Service Department would like to thank residents for their patience throughout the summer with all of the construction projects going on in the Township. The 2021 road resurfacing projects were a great improvement to township roads. The Lake County Engineers' Crile Road widening project improves the flow of traffic by providing a turn lane. This project is a positive addition for the residents who frequent the businesses along Crile Road. The Ohio Department of Transportation did the resurfacing of Route 608 from the Geauga County line to Ravenna Road. The Service Department's concrete slab replacement program continues to improve the concrete roads in the township and done in-house by the Service Department, Our drainage crews performed many culvert replacements, ditch maintenance, and storm water enhancements throughout the township.

As long as the weather allows, the Service Department will be out maintaining the roadways and drainage ditches, along with enhancements to storm water runoff. As the summer season ends, the Service Department begins preparing for the winter season. Preventative maintenance to our snowplow equipment will take place so the trucks and plows are ready to go when the first snow hits. Our Maintenance Department maintains, repairs, and fabricates all of our equipment in-house. Please remember when approaching any crews working alongside the road to slow down and move over.

With the arrival of Fall, the Service Department will again offer the yard waste drop-off at the Service Department. Residents may bring their yard waste in biodegradable bags to the Service Department and drop them off in a material bin located next to the cell phone tower. Signs will be posted to guide residents where to go. The hours of operation for the drop-off are Monday – Friday from 7:30am-2:30pm. The Service Department will also offer a brush collection this Fall, however dates have not yet been determined. Residents are encouraged to watch the Concord Township website for information on Brush Days.

HOW TO LOCATE YOUR PROPERTY MARKERS

Property markers (pins) are metal pins placed at every corner of the property, including any angle or change of direction of the boundary line. Each pin is shown on the survey of each property. Property owners are responsible for knowing where their property lines are when applying for permits for projects such as installing fences, building additions, and sheds.



Property pin location is important information to avoid legal and neighborhood disputes. Property lines or boundary lines are the defined points where one person's land ends and the neighboring land begins.

- 1. To ensure you can dig for your property markers safely, call OHIO811 System at 8-1-1, or submit a request on the website www.oups.org/edig to locate utility lines. They will need a 48 hour notice. This is a free service.
- 2. Obtain a copy of a survey of your property, an aerial view printout of your lot showing lot dimensions or obtain a copy of a plat drawing. We also recommend checking your address file at Concord Township Zoning Department for an existing survey or other site plan that would be helpful in your search for survey pins.

- Click on the Plat Maps button.
- Enter the name of the plat (subdivision) or partial name.
- Enter "Concord Township".
- Click on the Search for Plat button.

For site plans visit Lake County Engineer:

https://gis.lakecountyohio.gov/SitePlansApp/

- Choose Jurisdiction "Concord Township".
- Enter in the house number.
- Enter the street name (without the suffix)
- Click the search button.
- 3. Gather materials you will need to locate your property markers: survey (lot dimensions), tape measure, shovel and/or a metal detector can be used if you are having difficulty finding your pins.
- 4. Survey pins are typically 18 feet in from the curb. Go to your front curb and measure back about 18 feet in the area you think your marker should be. Use a metal detector and then start digging. The marker should be about 6-10 inches below the surface. Newer survey pins may have a colored cap with numbers on the top. Older survey pins will often be a hollow or solid metal pin.

If you are having difficulty locating your front curb to begin measuring, use the county plat drawing to determine with width of the public right of way in front of your property. If you live in a subdivision, the public right of way is typically 60 feet in width. Assume the road is centered in the right of way (not always the case). Measure from the center of the road (cautiously) towards your property, ½ the right of way width. Make this measurement multiple times along the front of your parcel, placing a marker each time. The markers defined by your measurements should roughly create your front lot line location. This will help you begin to find your property pins.

- 5. Once you have located the first pin, use your survey or plat map to check the distance to the next stake. Using your tape measure, measure the distance from the first pin, then use the metal detector and dig. Continue doing this until all pins are found.
- 6. Once survey pins are found, place a stake or marker of some type adjacent to the survey pin. Pull a string between the stakes to help define the property line.7. If you are unable to find your pins, contact a licensed Professional Land Surveyor. You can google or look in the phone directory "Yellow Pages" for local area land surveying firms.

NEW DECORATIONS

- One (1) artificial decoration per occupied gravesite is allowed – November 15th-March 31st
- One (1) steel rod hanger (shepherd's hook) is permitted per monument; hangers shall be placed flush at the side of the monument; all hangers must have a visible decoration at all times for the safety of those walking by the hanger.

WOODEN CROSSES

- Wooden crosses shall not exceed 24" above the ground, 12" in width and are temporarily permitted to mark the location of gravesites under the following circumstances only:
 - * If a permanent monument has not yet been placed
 - * Mark any monument under 18" tall from November 15th-March 31st

COLUMBARIUM DECORATIONS

- Columbarium decorations (such as holiday, medals, etc.) are not permitted on individual niches.
- Funeral flowers, live or artificial, and any other decoration(s) at the time of burial are left at the base of the columbarium for three (3) days; decorations are then removed by the Cemetery Department.




