7:19 p.m. 1 2 CHAIRMAN McINTOSH: Good evening. I want to apologize for starting a few minutes late here, five minutes. 3 We have a 7:15 previously scheduled, now 7:20, public hearing 4 to discuss a number of text, 11 text amendments to the Concord 5 Township zoning code as proposed by the Zoning Commission. 6 So with that, I would just invite our Zoning 7 Inspector, Ms. Heather Freeman, to give us a -- I know we've 8 talked about it but if you could just give a rundown on these 9 10 amendments and take us through real quick what we've got. 11 MS. FREEMAN: Sure, I would be happy to. 12 CHAIRMAN McINTOSH: Thank you. 13 MS. FREEMAN: So the Zoning Commission, over the last three for four months, has been working diligently to 14 review the list of permitted and conditionally permitted uses 15 in our existing Commercial and Industrial Districts. 16 They put together for your -- put together their recommendation for 17 18 your approval for several amendments to the Zoning Resolution. The majority of these amendments affect the Table of Uses, 19 20 Section 22.03, which is the bulk of the second amendment. And 21 many of the subsequent amendments that relate to Section 13 22 relate the to changes that are proposed in the Table of Uses. 23 There were also a few revisions within the specific 24 conditional use permit requirements, for example, referencing 25 to the Ohio Fire Code, and there are some updates to the 26 outdoor storage requirements that businesses will have to 27 follow should they propose that.

28 Two other changes that are unrelated to those 29 already mentioned include a modification to the definition of 30 Indoor Recreation and also some new proposed regulations for the charity or otherwise known as donation boxes that might
 pop up in our commercial districts.

In your packet, you will see that we also had a 3 letter from the Lake County Planning Commission, dated 4 March 30, 2023. They reviewed this at their meeting. They 5 did recommend approval of the proposed amendments with some 6 suggested modifications to those amendments. 7 The Zoning Commission did consider the Planning Commission's 8 recommendations at that their public hearing that was held on 9 10 April 4th and they did incorporate some of the changes that the Planning Commission was recommending, and those are 11 12 incorporated into the amendments that are in front of you this 13 evening.

14 I will just note the two items from the County Planning Commission's letter that they did consider including 15 in these amendments that are in front of you tonight relates 16 to bullet point number 3, which was, Do not add outdoor 17 display as a conditionally permitted use in the RD-2 District. 18 So that is something that we did take out. And then also the 19 bullet point number 4, change 13.32, letter B, Outdoor Display 20 21 into Section 13.33 and then renumber all the current sections 22 that follow after that.

So that is the high level of review of what's in
front of you tonight, and I am happy to answer any questions
if you have anything at this point.
